Parliamentary Election - 05.08.2020

A Brief Note on the Casting of Vote and Marking of Preferences

- 01. At the Parliamentary Election scheduled to be held on the 05th August 2020, the voter should cast his/ her vote by marking a cross (X) against the name and symbol of the Political Party or Independent Group of his/ her choice, on the ballot paper.
- O2. Thereafter, the voter can mark crosses (X) on the preferential numbers of not more than three candidates nominated by that recognized Political Party / Independent Group in the cages where the numbers appear.
- 03. At the count of ballot papers following will be rejected;
 - 3.1. No vote is marked against any Political Party or Independent Group
 - 3.2. Vote is marked for more than one Political Party
 - 3.3. Vote is marked for more than one Independent Group
 - 3.4. Vote is marked for more than one Political Party or for more than one Independent Group or for a combination of one or more Political Party and Independent Group
 - 3.5. Ballot papers where anything is written or marked by which the voter can be identified
 - 3.6. If it is uncertain to find out to which Political Party or the Independent Group the voter had cast his/ her vote.
- 04. Ballot papers which are not properly marked will not be counted for preferences.
- 05. Following ballot papers will be rejected or not valid at the court of preferences;
 - 5.1. Preference not marked for any candidate
 - 5.2. Preferences marked for more than three candidates

5.3. Uncertain to find out to which candidate the preference have been marked.
