# **Administration Report of the Commissioner of Elections for the year 2012**

## **01. Introduction**

- 1.1. Certification of Electoral Registers for the year 2011, enumeration of electors and certification of electoral registers for the year 2012, conduct of Provincial Council Elections in Eastern, North Central and Sabaragamuwa Provinces, and action in respect of filling of vacancies in the Parliament, Provincial Councils and Local Authorities were the principal activities of the Department of Elections during the year 2012.
- 1.2. Although the electoral register of an year was, up to now traditionally certified on or about 31<sup>st</sup> May of the following year, under the procedure currently followed in the annual revision, the electoral register of the year 2012 was certified within the same year i.e. on 31<sup>st</sup> December 2012. The achievement of the Department to certify the 2012 register in the same year and the certification of electoral registers of two years, viz. 2011 and 2012, in one calendar year (2012) can be recorded as a significant event.

## **02. Registration of Electors Act No. 44 of 1980**

- 2.1. Revision of Electoral Registers - 2011
  - 2.1.1. The enumeration of electors for the year 2011 commenced on 01<sup>st</sup> June, 2011. To make the qualified persons aware of the procedure to get their names included in the electoral register for the respective year, necessary steps were taken to publish a notice under the Section 12(1) of the Registration of Electors Act No. 44 of 1980 in the Government Gazette No. 1708/17 on 01<sup>st</sup> June, 2011 and to publish a notice on the same day in Sinhala, Tamil and English in the newspapers.
  - 2.1.2. Necessary instructions to enumerate electors in all electoral districts were issued to Registering Officers and the Commissioner of Elections informed the Secretaries of all the recognized political parties on 30<sup>th</sup> March, 2011 regarding the revision and the procedure for appointing their representatives.

- 2.1.3. The “A” and “B” lists that were prepared after the enumeration, were exhibited along with the operative register for perusal by the public from 02<sup>nd</sup> November, 2011 to 30<sup>th</sup> November, 2011. Accordingly, 853,912 names were deleted and 995,380 new names were added from the operative register (2010) of all the electoral districts at the revision of the electoral registers at the 2011 revision. Opportunity to submit claims and objections for the year 2011, was given during the period of exhibition. The notice under 13(2) of the Registration of Electors Act, regarding submitting of such documents, was published on 02<sup>nd</sup> November, 2011 in the Gazettee No. 1730/10 and in the newspapers.
- 2.1.4. District Registering Officers of all the electoral districts received 1,14,173 claims and 578 objections. Details are given in Table No.1.
- 2.1.5. After defeating the terrorist groups in the Northern Province in the year 2009, Government took steps to accommodate displaced families in welfare camps established mainly in Vavuniya until their resettlement. In addition, a considerable number of families were living in temporary residences of their choice. Those families were from almost all polling divisions of the Northern Province, but most of them were from Kilinochchi, Mullativu, Mannar and Vavuniya polling divisions.
- 2.1.6. Resettlement of the displaced persons had commenced after the security forces confirmed the removal of land mines laid by terrorist groups. Due to the resettlement being confined to certain areas from time to time there were a few areas which were unsettled even by 01<sup>st</sup> June, 2011.
- 2.1.7. It was observed that, a fair number of the families, which moved to Puttalam District due to the insecurity in the Mannar District had resettled in permanently built dwellings in Puttalam District. But most of them were attempting to register in the electoral register of Mannar under their original residential addresses as they did not wish to register in the Puttalam District. The number of persons who submitted claims for registration in Mannar polling division,

was therefore high, but considerable number of such claims were rejected due to their genuine residencies are in another district and unavailability of dwelling houses or residences to register them as electors.

- 2.1.8. Except for a small area in the Northern Province it was possible to carry out door to door enumeration by Grama Niladharies in 2011. Door to door enumeration could not be carried out in 46 polling districts of Kankasanthurai, Kopai, Point Pedro and Kilinochchi polling divisions in Electoral District No. 10 - Jaffna and in 11 polling districts of Mullativu and Mannar polling divisions in No. 11 - Vanni, where resettlement of the general public has not yet been taken place.
- 2.1.9. However, necessary action was taken to enumerate the previously registered electors of the aforementioned Grama Niladhari divisions, who were living in refugee camps or with their relatives and to register them under their original addresses subject to revisions where necessary. Names of the persons who did not possess details, were retained without changes as in the previous electoral registers. Details of the relevant polling divisions and polling districts are given in the Table II.
- 2.1.10. Section 12(7) of the Registration of Electors Act No. 44 of 1980 stipulates steps that should be taken in regard to plural registration. The computer software used for the preparation of electoral registers in all electoral districts for year 2011, helped to obtain reports on persons with the same National Identity Card number who have requested to register their names under several addresses in one or more electoral districts.
- 2.1.11. A special programme to correct errors in National Identity Card numbers when preparing electoral registers, was launched at the revision of electoral registers in year 2011. Action was taken to obtain information about National Identity cards, which were not earlier supplied by electors or supplied but not correctly entered or not computerized by the Electoral District Officers. This information was obtained by letters or through Grama Niladaries.

2.1.12. Further, while these National Identity Card numbers were computerized at district level, action was taken to **trace the plural registrations** by obtaining the data base to the Head Office twice. Accordingly, plural registration among districts was revealed as mentioned below.

2.1.13. More attention was drawn to the 3,54,382 electors who were related to the plural registration, stated in Paragraph 2.1.12. Those reports were examined at the Head Office and necessary action was taken to inform the electors and obtain their information.

2.1.14. When plurally registered persons were detected, they were informed by the Commissioner of Elections, about the necessity of registering under one qualifying address and steps were taken to register them only under one address. Thus, 108,774 names that were subjected to plural registration among district were deleted from the electoral register in 2011 and 30,505 names out of that were in Colombo Electoral District.

2.1.15. Besides, plural registration at polling division level within the district was searched at the District Election Offices. Accordingly, action was taken to register the names of the plural registered electors, under one qualifying address according to their responses to the letters inquiring their consent about the address they preferred most and when they did not respond, such names were registered under one suitable address only by deleting them from other addresses. Details of number of deleted names at the revision of Electoral Register in year 2011, because of plural registration within and among the district at Electoral Districts Level are shown in Table III.

- 2.1.16. Electoral Register for the year 2011 was certified on 25<sup>th</sup> May, 2012 in terms of Section 18 of the Registration of Electors Act. The notice to that affect in terms of Section 20 of the Act was published in Gazettee No. 1759/34 of 25<sup>th</sup> May, 2012 and in newspapers.
- 2.1.17. Comparative number of registered electors in the year 2010 and 2011 and comparative numbers of electors in the polling divisions of each Electoral District from year 2002 to 2011 are shown in Table IV and V respectively.
- 2.1.18. The determination of the Commissioner of Elections in terms of Article 98(8) of the Constitution regarding the number of members to be elected from each electoral district at Parliamentary Election based on the statements provided by Registering Officers under Section 23 of the Registration of Electors Act, after certifying the Electoral Registers in 2011, was published in the Gazette No. 1771/2 of 13<sup>th</sup> of August, 2012. Relevant details are shown in Table VI.
- 2.1.19. Accordingly, the number of members for No. 11 - Vanni Electoral District was decreased by one and the number of members for No. 20 - Moneragala Electoral District was increased by one. Comparative statement on the number of members of Parliament to be elected for each electoral district (2003-2012), under the Article 98(8) of the Constitution is shown in Table VII.
- 2.1.20. The total number of members to be elected to the Parliament at a General Election is 196 and out of which 160 members are distributed by the Commissioner of Elections under Article 98 (8) of the Constitution, after certification of the electoral register annually, in proportion to the number of electors registered in each electoral district. The remaining 36 members to be elected were allocated to 22 electoral districts under Article 96(4) of the Constitution by the Delimitation Commission based on the criteria stipulated in the Constitution.

2.1.21. Though the Secretaries of all recognized political parties were informed, by the Commissioner of Elections, about the importance of their participation at the enumeration of electors, it has been observed every year that only two or three of them paid attention to the matter. However, it is regrettable to observe that, without participating in observation of the enumeration process, that they habitually complain, at the time of elections, of deletion of names of their supporters. Participation of agents of political parties relevant to the revision of year 2011 is shown in Table VIII.

2.1.22. Enumerators were informed to pay special attention to the National Identity Cards at the time of enumeration, as it has been made compulsory at the time of voting. Accordingly, it was revealed in the year 2011 that approximately 92% of electors on the whole, had obtained the National Identity Cards. Number of persons, who produced National Identity Cards at the enumeration and the comparative statement on the percentage of persons, producing details of the Identity Cards at the revision of Electoral Registers, from year 2002 to 2011 are shown in Table IX and X respectively.

2.1.23. Electoral Register for year 2011 was published in the department website on 08<sup>th</sup> August, 2012. Accordingly, every elector has an opportunity to verify whether his name was registered or not and obtain information regarding the registration by logging his National Identity Card number.

## 2.2. Revision of Electoral Register - 2012

2.2.1. The notice under Section 12(1) of the Registration of Electors Act relevant to the commencement of enumeration of electors for 2012 was published in Gazette No. 1760/43 of 01<sup>st</sup> June, 2012 and on the same day a notice was also published in Sinhala, Tamil and English newspapers.

2.2.2. Instructions on the enumeration of electors in all the electoral districts were issued to the District Registering Officers on 24<sup>th</sup> April, 2012 and Secretaries of recognized political parties were informed by the Commissioner of Elections about the revision and the appointment of party representatives on 09<sup>th</sup> April, 2012.

- 2.2.3. The enumeration of electors commenced on 01<sup>st</sup> June, 2012 and the “A” and “B” lists, prepared after the enumeration, were exhibited with the operative register for perusal by the public from 04<sup>th</sup> October, 2012 to 31<sup>st</sup> October, 2012. There were 841,199 names to be deleted and 1,042,386 new names to be inserted to the operative register (2011) relevant to the revision of Electoral registers for year 2012. Claims and objections for the year 2012 were accepted during this period. The notice about exhibition of these documents was published under Section 13(2) of the Registration of Electors Act in the Gazette No. 1778/31 of 04<sup>th</sup> October, 2012 and in the newspapers on the same day.
- 2.2.4. Steps were taken to inform, all the members of Parliament and Provincial Councils, and all the members of Local Authorities, Secretaries of all Ministries, Chief Secretaries of all Provincial Councils , Secretaries of Provincial Ministries and Heads of all Government Departments, Corporations and Boards about the commencement of enumeration on 01<sup>st</sup> June, 2012, in addition to the normal procedures followed so far i.e. publishing notices in newspapers, advertising through electronic medias, and exhibiting notices at Grama Niladhari Division level. Furthermore, the background was created to obtain wide public co-operation by informing Principals of all government schools and through them the students, trade unions and Superintendent of estates.
- 2.2.5. Bearing in mind the obstructions encountered in the enumeration of electors and in getting back the documents within the intended periods, in addition to holding of instruction classes to enumerators to make them aware of the procedure, in 2012 steps were taken for officers of District Election Offices to participate in Grama Niladhari division day meetings held monthly at the Divisional Secretariats and issue instructions and for Deputy/ Senior Assistant/ Assistant Commissioners of Elections to attend monthly meetings held in District Secretariats for Divisional Secretaries and discuss with them matters relating to the annual revision. This helped in completing the enumeration process and the return of documents on time.



- 2.2.6. A special programme was carried out at the revision of Electoral Registers for 2012, to register Tamil speaking, Indian origin people in Estates, who were still not registered as electors. In this connection, Superintendents and Welfare Officers of Estates, Principals of Estate schools were made aware of the enumeration process. People in estates were also informed by the Plantation Community Communication Facilitators, based at the Divisional Secretariats and the Grama Niladharis in Estate areas. Mr. A.S. Karunanidhi, Retired Assistant Commissioner of Elections Department was deployed on a full time basis for the enumeration of persons in estates, specially in Nuwara Eliya and Ratnapura districts. Attention was paid to enumerate people who were still not enumerated at the door to door enumeration on 01<sup>st</sup> June, 2012. Lists of names deleted from the operative register and new names to be inserted were exhibited in October, 2012, names of non registered persons were identified and inserted by way of claims. However, it should be noted that the apathy shown by the people in estates to register as electors and non production of any necessary document to authenticate the age were some difficulties experienced in this regard.
- 2.2.7. House to house enumeration of electors was conducted in the Northern Province in 2012 by enumerating officers except for a limited area where displaced persons have not been resettled in 39 polling districts of Kankasanthurai, Kopai, Point Pedro and Kilinochchi polling divisions in Electoral District No. 10 Jaffna and one polling division in Mannar district which belongs to No. 11 Vanni Electoral District. Normal enumeration was done in Vavuniya and Mullativu District in No. 11 Vanni Electoral District as resettlement was completed in these areas. Instructions were given to retain the names of the electors who could not be enumerated by door to door enumeration as per the previous year Electoral Register i.e. year 2011. Details of the relevant polling divisions and polling districts are shown in Table XI.

2.2.8. Regarding the revision of year 2012, 83,571 Claims and 1,374 objections were received by District Registering Officers for each electoral district. Instructions were given to District Registering Officers to hold inquiries in relation to them, within November and first week of December. The details of claims and objections, received for each electoral district and the accepted and rejected claims and objections are given in Table XII.

2.2.9. A special programme was conducted by the Computer Section regarding plural registration, in relation to revision of Electoral Registers for year 2012. Under this, the following details were obtained and the electors who had been enumerated at more than one address were written to and their preference regarding the address at which the name should be registered obtained.

- Plural registration reports among the “B” names (new names which were not in the operative register but to be included in the revised register)) within the district.
- Plural registration reports between “B” names and 2011 register within the district
- Plural registration reports between “B” names within the district and 2011 register of all other districts.
- Plural registration reports among “B’ names of all districts

Where no replies were received, they were registered at the address decided by the District Registering Officer/ Commissioner of Elections. Accordingly, they were informed to register their names under one address which he/she prefer most and registration was done according to the decision of the District Registering Officers/ Commissioner of Elections, if the replies were not received on the due date. Situations where two persons under the same National Identity Card numbers were also revealed at the examinations carried out by sending letters to the relevant electors. However, 72319 names of plural registration were deleted. Details of the number of deleted names, because of plural registration, relating to each electoral district are shown in Table XIII.

2.2.10. Action was taken by the Department of Elections to delete the names of two persons, from the Electoral Register, since they were reported to be imprisoned under the Bribery Act and Elections Laws, for offences committed at elections and other reasons, in year 2012. Relevant details are shown in Table XIV.

2.2.11. Electoral Register for year 2012 for certified on 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2012, under the Section 18 of the Registration of Electors Act No. 44 of 1980. This was published by a notice in the Gazette No. 1791/1 on 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2012 and in the newspapers on same day under the Section 20 of the aforementioned Act.

### 03. **Parliamentary Elections Act No. 1 of 1981**

#### 3.1. Recognition of Political Parties

3.1.1. Provisions relevant to the recognition of political parties, in the Parliamentary Elections Act No. 1 of 1981, were amended by Parliamentary Elections (Amendments) Act No. 58 of 2009 of 16<sup>th</sup> September, 2009. Accordingly, the Commissioner of Elections should call for applications from political parties for recognition in January every year. If any election is pending during that month, applications should be called within 30 days after the conclusion of such election.

3.1.2. Due to the holding of elections to Local Authorities on 17<sup>th</sup> March, 2011, 23<sup>rd</sup> July, 2011 and 08<sup>th</sup> October, 2011 (in 2011) and as the elections to Pudukudiruppu and Maritimé pattu Pradeshiya Sabhas in Mullativu District were scheduled to be held before 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2011 action was not possible in terms of the Act to take steps in regard to recognition of political parties during the year 2011.

3.1.3. Elections to Pudukudiruppu and Maritimé pattu Pradeshiya Sabhas in Mullativu Districts which were scheduled to be held on 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2011, were postponed to 10<sup>th</sup> March, 2012 due to demining of land mines to the resettlement process not being over. Therefore, publishing of the notice relevant to the recognition of parties during the month of January, 2012 was prevented.

3.1.4. Elections to the aforementioned two Pradeshiya Sabhas which were scheduled to be held on 10<sup>th</sup> March, 2012 were further postponed to 24<sup>th</sup> March, 2012.

Meanwhile, two petitioners who filed cases viz. No. CA(Writ) 72/2012 and CA(Writ) 74/2012 on 12<sup>th</sup> March, 2012 in the Court of Appeal and requested to postpone the elections to Pudukudiruppu and Maritimepattu Pradeshiya Sabhas as the resettlement is not completed. These petitions were considered by Court of Appeal on 19<sup>th</sup> March, 2012 and an interim order was issued to postpone the elections, which were scheduled to hold on 24<sup>th</sup> March 2012 until the hearing of the petitions were completed. Applications for recognition of new parties could not be called, as these cases were pending and the elections have to be held in accordance with the judgement. Meanwhile notices about holding elections to Eastern, North Central and Sabaragamuwa Provincial Councils were published on 28<sup>th</sup> June, 2012 and elections were held on 08<sup>th</sup> September, 2012. Therefore, this election period had also been left out, even though applications for recognition of political parties could have been called after one month of conducting these elections. There was no possibility to do so as the judgement regarding elections to Pudukudiiruppu and Maritimepaththu Pradeshiya Sabhas in Mullativu District had not been received. Advice in this regard have been sought from the Attorney General and action would be taken in accordance with his advice.

3.1.5 Necessary steps, regarding recognition of parties for year 2012 could not be taken according to the provisions of the Act, due to the above reasons.

3.2 Under Section 7(4)(b) of Parliamentary Elections Act, the Commissioner of Elections should publish the list of Recognized Political Parties in the Government Gazette at the beginning of each year. For the year 2012, it was published in the Extraordinary Gazette No. 1743/19 at 31<sup>st</sup> January, 2012 and the list of those Political Parties is given in Table XV.

- 3.3 Recognized Political Parties mentioned below were ceased to be recognized Political Parties, in terms of Section 9(3) of the Parliamentary Elections Act No. 1 of 1981, as these parties failed to submit documents, required under Section 8 of the aforementioned Act, within the specified period, to the Commissioner of Elections.
- 3.3.1 Eelam National Democratic Liberation Front
  - 3.3.2 National Unity Alliance
  - 3.3.3 People's Front of Liberation Tigers

The names of the aforementioned political parties were not included in the list of recognized Political Parties published on 31<sup>st</sup> January, 2012 for the year 2012 and a media release was also issued on 01<sup>st</sup> February, 2012 regarding the above matter.

- 3.4 One vacancy in the Membership of Parliament was filled in 2012 and detail of it is shown in Table XVI.
04. Administration report of the Commissioner of Elections for the year 2011, was tabled in the Parliament on 22<sup>nd</sup> August, 2012.
05. Provincial Councils Elections Act No. 2 of 1988.
- 5.1. Provincial Councils Election - 2012
    - 5.1.1. Provincial Councils of Eastern, North Central and Sabaragamuwa were dissolved at midnight of 27<sup>th</sup> June, 2012. Accordingly, notices of nominations for Batticaloa, Ampara, Trincomalee, Anuradhapura, Polonnaruwa, Ratnapura and Kegalle Administrative Districts which belongs to these Provincial Councils were published in Extra Ordinary Gazette No. 1764/15 of 28<sup>th</sup> June, 2012.
    - 5.1.2. Accordingly, nominations were received at relevant offices of District Returning Officers from 12<sup>th</sup> July, 2012 to 12.00 noon on 19<sup>th</sup> July, 2012. Out of 179 nominations received, 04 were rejected. A total number of 3,073 candidates from 175 recognized nominations of 25 recognized political parties and 86 independent groups were in the contest. There were 3,148,020 registered voters and 108 members were elected at polls held at 2,842 polling stations.

## 5.2. Procedure followed at the election

- 5.2.1. The competition between candidates of each of the political parties and among the candidates of the same party for preferences commenced immediately after the period of nominations. Commissioner of Elections received a large number of complaints on displaying of illegal posters, banners, cutouts and misusing of state property and resources for the election campaign. Eagerness of candidates to donate various goods and other items to electors, was a significant feature at this election than seen at past elections. Attempts to donate even Government owned commodities were reported in a few districts. Establishment of election offices more than legally allowed by political parties and independent groups was also observed.
- 5.2.2. Number of complaints received by the Commissioner of Elections grew rapidly with the development of this situation. Action was taken to establish complaint centres in all District Secretariats apart from the complaint centre established at the Elections Secretariat to accept complaints. Steps were taken to increase the number of centres for accepting complaints where incidents were on the increase.
- 5.2.3. Additionally a Standing Committee comprising of representatives of contesting political parties and of election observer bodies and the participation of the Inspector General of Police was also established at this Centre for monitoring of complaints and to review the progress and to obtain views and opinions on issues that arose and ensure a free and fair election.
- 5.2.4. Deputy/ Senior Assistant/ Assistant Commissioners of all districts, where elections there were no elections, were attached to the districts where elections were scheduled and all steps were taken to prevent increasing illegal activities.
- 5.2.5. Secretaries of Ministries, Chief Secretaries of Provincial Councils and Heads of Institutions were issued written instructions on prohibition of misusing of public property. Additional Secretaries

of Ministries were summoned to a meeting held at the Elections Secretariat, which in depth instructions were given on prevention of misuse of state property. Lengthy discussions about the steps to be followed at Government Institutions on appointments and transfers during this period were held. Large amount of complaints about appointments and transfers on political grounds were received during this periods and necessary steps were followed regarding them.

5.2.6. Guidelines for private and public media institutions and giving instructions about conducting media during the period of the election was issued and heads of media institutions were briefed on their behavior. Further, the issue of codes of conduct to the political parties could be considered as an important feature at this election.

5.2.7. The Commissioner of Elections continuously interacted personally with the Secretaries of Ministries, Chief Secretaries of Provincial Councils and District Secretaries during this period and took all necessary steps to ensure the conduct of fair and peaceful election by preventing illegal activities.

5.2.8. Steps which were followed at the previous elections to ensure the security of polling centres and ballot boxes were implemented at this time also and necessary action was also taken after considering the various requests made by the political parties in this regard. Necessary steps were followed to rid of doubts of the political parties regarding the poll, counting of votes and declaration of results.

### 5.3. Pre election period and poll day

5.3.1. The poll day was calm, though the pre-election period recorded disturbances, violations and difficulties to some extent. No obstructive incidents to carry out the poll was reported other than some minor cases. Specially, emerging of troubling situations regarding personation was minimum as the National Identity Card was mandatory for expressing the vote.

5.3.2. A minimum of one officer from other districts was deployed to polling stations, besides the officers in the district for poll duties. All the officers of the Department of Elections and officers from other departments who were engaged with the duties of the Department were also attached to the duties in the relevant districts. The aim of the Commissioner of Elections was to carry out an comprehensive observation about the election by them. The centres for receiving election related complaints which were established throughout the pre election period were further strengthened on the polling day. Necessary steps were taken to refer the complaints, which were received by them, to the relevant places instantly for follow take up action regarding them. Counting of votes commenced as scheduled as there were no adverse reports received through observation reports which justified annulment of polls.

5.4. Counting of votes and declaration of results

5.4.1. There were 384 counting centres established in seven districts and 329 being Ordinary Counting Centres and 55 Counting Centres for postal votes. Results of each centre were received and checked at the Head Office and confirmed by the Commissioner of Elections. Results which were confirmed, were given to the medias through the Director of Information and the electronic media for broadcast. Under the Section 60 of the Provincial Councils Elections Act No. 2 of 1988, the names of the elected members were published in the Gazette No. 1776/6 of 17<sup>th</sup> September, 2012 by Commissioner of Elections. Detailed results of the three provinces are shown in the Table XVII.

5.5. After a five bench judgement of the Supreme Court which heard the three Fundamental Rights Applications No. 243/06, 244/06 and 245/06 filed in 2006 challenging the amalgamation of Northern and Eastern Provinces declared that the amalgamation was invalid, an election to the Eastern Province was held on 10<sup>th</sup> May, 2008 on the order of the President. But no order was made by the President in 2012 regarding holding of an election to establish a Provincial Council in the Northern Province.



5.6. Details regarding to filling of vacancies of members of Provincial Councils during the year 2012 are shown in Table XVIII.

**06. Local Authorities Elections Ordinance**

- 6.1. 10<sup>th</sup> March, 2012, which was fixed on the date of poll of Puthukudiruppu and Maritimepattu Pradeshiya Sabha by the Returning Officer by his notice published in Gazette No. 1738/6 of 28<sup>th</sup> December, 2011 was again fixed for 24<sup>th</sup> March, 2012 by notice published in Gazette No. 1744/8 of 08<sup>th</sup> February, 2012.
- 6.2. However, two petitions i.e. CA(Writ) 72/2012 and CA(Writ) 74/2012 which challenged the holding of the elections, were filed at the Court of Appeal on 12<sup>th</sup> March, 2012. An interim order to postpone the elections, until completion of resettlement of people in welfare camps due to war situation prevailing in Northern and Eastern Provinces, was issued by the Court of Appeal after considering the petitions on 19<sup>th</sup> March, 2012.
- 6.3. The elections to Municipal Council Batticaloa, Pradeshiya Sabhas of Eravurpattu, Koralepattu, Koralepattu North, Manmune South and Eruvilpattu, Manmune, Manmune West, Manmune South West and Porativupattu in Batticaloa Administrative District which were postponed due to security reasons under the Local Authorities (Special Provisions) Act No. 30 of 2007, were held on 10<sup>th</sup> March, 2008. The terms of Office of these Councils were scheduled to cease on 10<sup>th</sup> March, 2012. But according to the Notice published by the Minister of Local Government and Provincial Councils in the Gazette No. 1737/5 of 19<sup>th</sup> December, 2011, the terms of office of these councils were extended to 17<sup>th</sup> March, 2013.
- 6.4. The Local Authorities Elections Ordinance (Chapter 262) was amended by the Local Authorities Elections (Amendment) Act No.22 of 2012 with effect from 15<sup>th</sup> November, 2012.
- 6.5. Accordingly, only vacancies in Municipal Councils, Urban Councils and Pradeshiya Sabhas were filled in year 2012 and the relevant details are shown in Table XIX, XX and XXI respectively.

07. **Staff**

- 7.1. Mr. M.K.S.S.Ratnayake, the Assistant Commissioner of Elections of Nuwara Eliya District, was appointed to the Class I of Sri Lanka Administrative Service by the Secretary of Public Service Commission, by his letter dated 26<sup>th</sup> February, 2012 with effect from 01<sup>st</sup> July, 2007 and was appointed as the Deputy Commissioner of Elections, Kandy Districts by the Commissioner of Elections by his letter dated 16<sup>th</sup> December, 2011.
- 7.2. Mr. H.A.S. Fernando, who was recruited to Sri Lanka Administrative Service on 01<sup>st</sup> September, 2003 assumed duties in the Department of Elections on 03<sup>rd</sup> January, 2012 and was appointed as Assistant Commissioner of Elections in Nuwara Eliya District with effect from 15<sup>th</sup> February, 2012.
- 7.3. Mr. K.A. Sumith Chandana, who joined the Class III of the Sri Lanka Administrative Service on 15<sup>th</sup> December, 2010, assumed duties in the Department of Elections on 02<sup>nd</sup> January, 2012. He was appointed as Assistant Commissioner of Elections in Mannar District from 20<sup>th</sup> June, 2012.
- 7.4. Mr. G.R.A.K. Gamlath, who had been appointed to the Sri Lanka Accountants' Service on 01<sup>st</sup> February, 2002, was transferred to the Department of Elections with effect from 02<sup>nd</sup> January, 2012 and he was appointed as Accountant (Internal Audit) of the Department with effect from 12<sup>th</sup> January, 2012.
- 7.5. Mr. D.T.I. Wickremaratne of Class III of the Sri Lanka Administrative Service, was attached to the Department with effect from 24<sup>th</sup> September, 2012 by the Secretary, Ministry of Public Administration and Home Affairs by his letter dated 19<sup>th</sup> September, 2012. Mr. Wickremaratne was appointed to a post of Assistant Commissioner of Elections effective from that date.
- 7.6. There were three vacancies in post of Supra Class of the Public Management Assistants Service. Mr. S.A.D. Praveena was appointed as Administrative Officer in the Kurunegala Elections Office.

- 7.7. Mr. R.H.K. Ranasinghe of the Supra Class of the Public Management Assistants Service, who was transferred from the Department of Pensions to this Department by the Secretary, Ministry of Public Administration by his letter dated 10<sup>th</sup> July, 2012, was appointed as the Administrative Officer of the Gampaha Election Office, with effects from 23<sup>rd</sup> July 2012.
- 7.8. Mr. A.M.M. Cabeer, Class I of the Public Management Service serving in Kurunegala Elections Office was promoted to the Supra Class of the same service by the Secretary, Ministry of Public Administration and Home Affairs by his letter dated 06<sup>th</sup> July 2012 and he was appointed as the Administrative Officer of the Kandy Elections Office with effects from 02<sup>nd</sup> August, 2012.
- 7.9. The total number of vacancies in cadre of the Public Management Assistants Service was 18 on 15<sup>th</sup> February, 2012. On the Secretary of the Ministry of Public Administration and Home Affairs being informed of the vacancies, he released 03 new recruits from the total of 2012 batch of recruits made to the Public Management Assistants Service in the year 2012.
- 7.10. In order to implement the two languages policy, fifteen posts were created with the approval of the Management Service Department in the cadre of Karyala Karya Sahayaka. On 01<sup>st</sup> March, 2012, 20 persons were recruited to these posts on 01<sup>st</sup> March, 2012 and 18<sup>th</sup> June, 2012. The additional 05 was to fill five other vacancies that existed.
- 7.11. Two Officers of the Public Management Assistants Service and two Karyala Karya Sahayaka resigned from service in 2012, due to personal reasons.

\* **Transfers**

- 7.12. Mr. A. Senanayaka, S.L.A.S. Class I who was serving on the Deputy Commissioner of Elections, Colombo Municipal Area Office was released from the Department with effect from 11<sup>th</sup> September, 2012 to the Department of Foreign Resources of the Ministry of Finance. This transfer was on the request made by the Secretary, Ministry of Public Administration and Home Affairs by his letter dated 20<sup>th</sup> May, 2012. His services to the Department is appreciated.

- 7.13. Mr. J.A.S.P. Jayasinghe, S.L.A.S. III who was serving as the Assistant Commissioner of Elections, Colombo District Office left the Department on transfer to the Ministry of Co-operative and Internal Trade for a period of one year at the request made by the Secretary, Ministry of Public Administration and Home Affairs by his letter dated 08<sup>th</sup> February, 2012. His return to the Department at the beginning of the year 2013, is expected.
- 7.14. Mr. M.M.S.K. Bandara Mapa, S.L.A.S. III, Assistant Commissioner of Elections, Ampara District was appointed as Divisional Secretary, Ampara by the Secretary, Ministry of Public Administration and Home Affairs by his letter dated 30<sup>th</sup> November, 2011. Mr. Mapa was therefore released from the Department with effect from 17<sup>th</sup> February, 2012; The services rendered to the Department by him is appreciated.
- 7.15. Mr. H.M.N. Dinipriya, S.L.A.S. III was released from the post of Assistant Commissioner of Elections, Matale District with effect from 17<sup>th</sup> February, 2012 enable him to assume duties as the Divisional Secretary, Wilgamuwa on the request made by the Secretary, Ministry of Public Administration and Home Affairs by his letter dated 20<sup>th</sup> February, 2012.
- 7.16. Mr. P. Kuganathan, S.L.A.S. Class III who was serving as the Assistant Commissioner of Elections, Jaffna District was at the request of the Secretary, Ministry of Public Administration and Home Affairs on 03<sup>rd</sup> October, 2012, released to the Provincial Administration Division of the Ministry of Public Administration and Home Affairs with effects from 15<sup>th</sup> October 2012. The services rendered to the Department by him is appreciated.
- 7.17. Mrs. J.A.S.P.A.D. Weerasooriya, of the Information Technology Service I/III, Computer System Analyst of the Department, was transferred to the Department of Inland Revenue with effect from 06<sup>th</sup> August, 2012 to assume duties as Information and Communication Technology Assistant. The transfer was effected at the request of the Secretary, Ministry of Public Administration and Home Affairs by his letter dated 18<sup>th</sup> July, 2012. The services rendered by her to the Department is appreciated.

- 7.18. Twelve Officers of the Public Management Assistants Service and four members of the Karyala Karya Sevaya was transferred out of the Department in 2012 under the annual transfers. Their services to the Department are appreciated.

### **Creation of New Posts**

- 7.19. The creation of a post of Deputy Commissioner of Elections for the Northern Province (S.L.A.S. I) and a post of Assistant Commissioner of Elections (S.L.A.S. III) for Mullativu District were approved by the Director General of the Management Services Department of the Ministry of Finance on 04<sup>th</sup> October 2012.
- 7.20. A post of Accountant (Payments) in Class III of the Sri Lanka Accountants' Service, in addition to the existing three posts of Accountants was created with the approval of Director General of the Management Services Department by his letter dated 30<sup>th</sup> November, 2012.
- 7.21. Steps were taken to create a few more posts with the approval of the Management Services Department in view of the increase in the work of the Department. Accordingly, 14 posts of the cadre of 23 of Computer Technical Officers were suppressed and instead 14 posts in the Public Management Service were created. The remaining 09 posts in the Computer Technical Officers were suppressed and 09 posts in the Information and Communications Technical Officers Service Class 2 Grade II were created. Besides to them 02 posts of Drivers, 02 posts of Public Management Assistants Service for the Internal Audit Unit and a post of Office Labourer were created.

### **Retirements**

- 7.22 During in year 2012, 12 staff members retired from Service. They were 09 Public Management Service Officers, 02 Karyala Karya Sahayakes and one Driver. The pension payments files of all the retirees were finalized on time. The services rendered by them all is appreciated. A list of names of the retirees is shown in Table XXII.

## 08. **Training Oversees**

- 8.1. Mr. E. Sumanasiri Ekanayake, Computer Programmer left for the Island on 25<sup>th</sup> August, 2012 to follow a two year course of study leading to a Combined Masters and Doctorate in Information Technology conducted by KAIST University in Korea from 26<sup>th</sup> August, 2012 to 31<sup>st</sup> August, 2014.
- 8.2. Mr. K.J.S. Madawa, Assistant Commissioner of Elections, Anuradhapura followed a Master Programme in Public Policy for Senior Officials, at the Peking University of Peoples Republic of China from 31<sup>st</sup> August, 2011 returned to the Island and reported for duty on 12<sup>th</sup> July, 2012.

## **Official Foreign Tours**

- 8.3. The Commissioner of Elections Mr. Mahinda Deshapriya, Deputy Commissioner Mr. M.M. Mohamed and the Co-ordinating Secretary of the Commissioner Mr. R.M.A. Hameed, participated in the Asian Regional Election Commissioners' conference held in New Delhi, India from 30<sup>th</sup> April to 02<sup>nd</sup> May, 2012.
- 8.4. The Commissioner of Elections, Mr. Mahinda Deshapriya, Assistant Commissioner of Elections, Vavuniya District, Mr. S. Sudhakaran and the Co-ordinating Secretary to the Commissioner, Mr. R.M.A. Hameed attended the 03<sup>rd</sup> Non Official Conference of Election Commissioners of South Asia organized by the Malaysia Commonwealth Studies Centre and held in India from on 14<sup>th</sup> to 15<sup>th</sup> October, 2012.
- 8.5. On the invitation to send a representative of the Department of Elections to attend a conference of Election stakeholders conducted in Bangkok by the Asian Network Foundation for Free Elections to be held on 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> December 2012, Mr. M.M. Mohamed, Deputy Commissioner of Elections participated in the conference.

## 09. Constructions and Assets

- 9.1. The new election office building, the construction of which commenced on 20<sup>th</sup> December, 2010, was opened on 15<sup>th</sup> July, 2012.
- 9.2. A new section 20 ft. x 10 ft. dimension was added to the transport unit of the Establishment Branch of the Elections Secretariat. The small auditorium refurbished with a conference address system and the toilets of the staff officers' lunch room was modernized. These improvements were at a cost of Rs.41,41,157/-.
- 9.3. On 16<sup>th</sup> April, 2012, the Ministry of Finance provided a vehicle (Cab) costing Rs.61,00,000/-. Its registered No. PD-8680.
- 9.4. On 27<sup>th</sup> April, 2012 the Ministry of Finance supplied three Toyota Vehicles (Cabs) at a cost of Rs.75,00,000/- each. The registration no of the vehicles on PD-9319, PD-9320 and PE-1635.
- 9.5. Tenders were called to sell for used vehicles belonging to Department of Elections. Their sale price at the open auction with their number are shown below.

## 10. **Financial Information**

- 10.1. Rs. 672.75/- million was spent for the Eastern, North Central and Sabaragamuwa Provincial Councils Elections. The cost per elector has increased when compared to the previous Local Authority Election. The reasons for the increase are the need to deploy more officers and staff to supervise the polling stations to ensure a free and fair election after resolving the unforeseen situation that prevailed in the three provinces increase in the cost of paper and increase in cost of printing, increase in prices of fuel, increase in the expenditure incurred by the Police and the Postal Department which assisted in the election process and the increase in the allowances to counting staff.
- 10.2. The cost of preparation of the 2012 Electoral Register was approximately Rs.80 million which shows a high reduction compared to the expenditure incurred in regard to the 2011 register. The expenditure in preparation of the register reduced due to advancement of the date of certification to 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2012 and the printing of the register by the private sector.
- 10.3. The recurrent expenses in 2012 was Rs. 912 million. Due to the inadequacy of the imprest another Rs. 80 million approximately is due to the State and private institutions. Since Local Authority Elections were held island wide, in 2011 the recurrent expenses in 2012 show a decrease of 1169 million rupees.
- 10.4. The capital expenditure in 2012 was Rupees 23.8 million which is Rupees 30.6 million less than in 2011. The reduction in the capital expenditure was due to construction of buildings was not undertaken during this year, except maintenance of buildings and supply of vehicle on lease by the Ministry of Finance.
- 10.5. All the applicants for loans were granted loans requested. Loans up to Rs. 12 million was paid to 132 member of the staff. This is an increase of Rs. 2.2 million compared for previous year.



- 10.6. Revenue earned by issue of extracts of the Electoral Register was Rs. 4.34 million. The reasons for reduction revenue in this regard in due to the arrangement made to obtain information of registration directly through Grama Niladhari, ability to obtain this information from the Web Site and limitation of issue of extracts for admission of children to schools in the first year.
- 10.7. The preparation of the Electoral Register in book form was reduced from 2012 and the preparation of the register in CD format was increased. The revenue earned by sale of register through CD's was Rs. 0.8 million.
- 10.8. The staff and non-staff officers were provided with domestic training courses to increase the efficiency of the department, at a cost of Rs.590,175/-.
