

# PERFORMANCE REPORT 2020





**Election Commission** 

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#### 1. Composition of the Election Commission

In pursuance of the 19 th Amendment to the Constitution, H.E. the President, on the recommendation of the Constitutional Council, apointed three members for 05 years period including the Chairman to the Election Commission. The first Election Commission assumed duties on 2015.11.17 ceased to function on 2020.12.03 and was comprised of –

- Mr. Mahinada Dehapriya (Chairman)
- Mr. N.J. Abeysekere PC (Member)
- Prof. S. Ratnajeevan H. Hoole (Member)

Although the term of the first commission was limited to five years, they could continue to serve until another commission was appointed under the 20th Amendment to the Constitution, and the first commission held office until the new commission was appointed on 2020.12.03

The Election Commission was entrusted with the responsibility to manage elections and to exercise the powers vested in it under the Constitution. The quorum of the three member Election Commission had been three which gave rise to issues involving—lack of legal capacity for the Commission to meet and the validity of the d—ecisions made at meetings where one Member was absent. The 20 <sup>th</sup>Amendment to the Constitution increased the number of members of the Election Commission to five (05) and setforth a quorum of three members for the commission meetings to proceeding with their business which provision resolved the existed issue.

The composition of the incumbent Election Commission appointed on 2020.12.03 in pursuance to the 20th amendment is as follows:

#### 2. Vision and Mission of the Election Commission

#### VISION

"A NATION THAT SAFEGUARDS UNIVERSAL FRANCHISE"

#### **MISSION**

"RAISE CRITICAL CONSCIOUSNESS AMONG ALL STAKEHOLDERS ENSURING THE PROTECTION OF THE PEOPLE'S RIGHTS, AND CONDUCT FREE, FAIR AND CREDIBLE ELECTIONS EFFICIENTLY AND EFFECTIVELY THAT SAFEGUARDS THE PEOPLE'S SOVEREIGNTY AND UNIVERSAL FRANCHISE BASED ON DEMOCRATIC PRINCIPLES"

#### 3. Goals and Objectives –

- All qualified citizens exercise their franchise fearlessly, freely, and confidentially in elections conducted in a free and fair manner.
- All citizens realize that exercising their franchise is an inalienable right and get involved in the election process actively.
- Equal and fair opportunities for all candidates during election periods.
- An all-inclusive, updated voter list is in place before every election.
- All citizens in the marginalized sectors of society engage in the electoral processes confidently and adequately.
- The election process is administered competently and transparently.
- The needs of the stakeholders for data and information related to the election process and the Election Commission are adequately fulfilled in a timely manner.

#### 4. Funcitions of the Election Commission

In terms of Article 103(2) of the Constitution, it is the core function of the Election Commission to conduct free and fair elections. In line therewith, the Election Commission has to conduct the Presidential Elections, Parliamentary Elections, Provincial Council Elections, Local Authorities Elections and Referendums in a free and fair manner and has to prepare and revise the electoral registers annually. In addition to these statutory duties, the Election Commission is entrusted with the statutory functions of filling of vacancies in the membership of Parliament, Provincial Councils, and Local Authorities and of the recognition and registration of political parties.

#### 5. Electoral Revision – 2019

- 5.1. Since the preparation of electoral registers for 2019 had been completed at district levels, necessary steps were taken to certify the electoral register for 2019 through the respective Deputy/Assistant Commissioners of Elections of all electoral districts of the island on 2020.01.24 and to publish the notification thereon in all three official languages in the Gazette Extraordinary No. 2159/40 (Annexure 01), in newspapers and on the official website of the Election Commission on that day itself and also to display the registers at district election offices and Divisional Secretariats/Grama Niladhari offices of the island.
- 5.2. A notification was published in the Gazette Extraordinary No. 2159/63, dated 2020.01.25 announcing that applications would be received from 2020.01.25 to 2020.01.31 for the preparation of the supplementary register in terms of the provisions of the Registration of Electors (Special Provisions) Act, No. 10 of 2017, and the press

release in that connection was published in newspapers in all three official languages. Also, a notification on the appeal period for the inclusion of names in the supplementary register from 2020.02.01 to 2020.02,14 was published in the Gazette Extraordinary No. 2160/62, dated 2020.02.01 (Annexure 02) and the relevant media release thereon was published in newspapers in all three official languages. However, applications for the supplementary register had been received from only the Mannar polling division of the Vanni electoral district and action was taken to certify the supplementary register for 2019 through the Assistant Registration officers of the Vanni district on 2020.02.15. The notification thereon was published in the Gazette Extraordinary No. 2162/70 (Annexure 03) and in newspapers in all three languages. 21 applications were received during the allotted period and out of them only 11 were eligible to be registered as electors in the supplementary register for 2019.

The total number of electors registered in the year 2019 stood at 16,263,885.

- 5.3. Number of Members of Parliament to be returned from each electoral district based on the number of electors registered under respective electoral district in the electoral register for 2019 for the purpose of Paragraph (8) of Article 98 of the Constitution of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka upon the preparation and cerification of the annual electoral register is given in **Annexure 04.**
- 5.4. The following data and details related to the 2019 Electoral Register are included in this report as Annexure.

#### 6. Electoral Revision – 2020

The electoral revision 2020 became a challenging uphill task due to the spread of the Covid-19 pandemic.

In the first phase of the annual electoral revision process, the printing of BC forms for all districts through the Government Press should be completed in the month of March every year, and the printed BC forms should reach all District Election Offices in the month of April and the District Election Offices should conduct classes to give necessary instructions to the Grama Niladharis / Enumerators and should finalize the distribution of BC forms to Grama Niladharis in the same month. The BC forms should then be distributed to chief occupants of every household in the island by the Grama Niladharis / Enumerators before the end of May. However, the spread of Covid-19 pandemic in the island during the months of March/April/May where the electoral revision process was due to commence, the measures taken by the government to impose a quarantine curfew to curb the spread of the Covid-19 pandemic, measures taken to allow public officers to work from their homes and to limit the number of officers to report to duties at office and the decision to deploy a limited number of officials in preliminary arrangements for the parliamentary election hampered the usual conduct of electoral revision for 2020.

However, in pursuant to the discussion held with all the District Deputy / Assistant Commissioners of Elections on 20<sup>th</sup>April 2020 and the subsequent discussions had with the representatives of the Grama Niladhari Trade Union, it was decided that the district election office should obtain the details of the new settlers, those who have changed their residence, those who have completed 18 years of age and those who have died as at 01 June on a specimen form and in addition to obtain such information also through e-technology and the Election Commission duly granted approval to pursue action as decided.

Also, a discussion was held with all the District Deputy / Assistant Commissioners of Elections on May 20, 2020, where views were sought on future revision activities and the process of holding the 2020 - Parliamentary Election under a controlled Covid - 19 pandemic situation.

In response to a request made by several District Election Offices to continue with the procedure followed in the past several years to provide the chief occupant with a new BC form with the names of persons who have previously been registered under the household printed on the form for the year 2020 as well, the Election Commission decided to get the BC forms containing the information of electors, printed through the Government Press for every district of the island.

Gazette Notification No. 2178/13 dated 01.06.2020 (**Annexure 17**) was published and an advertisement was also published in the Divaina, Daily News and Weerakeshari newspapers announcing that the registration of electors for the year 2020 had been commenced in pursuance to Section 12(1) of the Registration of Electors Act, No. 44 of 1980. Necessary arrangements were made for the public display of this notification in all the offices of District Registering / Assistant Registering Officers / Divisional Secretariats / Local Government Institutions and all Grama Niladhari Offices in the island.

In the annual electoral revision, the first phase will be the field enumeration, which is carried out by the Grama Niladaris who are entrusted with the statutory duty. As a sufficient duration of time is required for the task, the Secretary, Ministry of Public Administration, Home Affairs, Provincial Councils and Local Government has granted approval, upon request, to suspend the transfers of Grama Niladaris and to limit the number of days to keep the Grama Niladari offices open/ extend the services on retirement during the field enumeration period of the electoral revision 2020 as well and necessary steps have been taken to inform all the District Registering / Assistant Registering Officers and through them all the Divisional Secretaries in that regard.

All District Deputy / Assistant Commissioners of Elections were informed to take necessary steps to personally inquire into all complaints made to the Head Office and District Election Offices regarding the non-receipt of official poll cards at the Presidential Election 2019/Parliamentary Elections 2020 and non-inclusion of their names in the electoral register despite being residents of the same household for over a long time and to register all such persons if they are eligible to register as electors for the year 2020 upon site inspections if required.

The letter dated 2020.07.24 was sent to Secretaries of all recognized political parties with copies to all District Registering/Assistant Registering Officers and to the Executive Directors / Coordinators of the election monitoring organizations informing that the field enumeration of the electoral revision 2020 hadbegun and requesting them to hand over the lists of names of the representatives of their respective political parties to the relevant District Election Offices for the observation activities on or before 2020.08.10. However, in pursuant to the request made by some Secretaries that the period be extended since their active members were engaged in propaganda work for the parliamentary election 2020 the Election Commission approved the extension of that period, and another letter informing the same was sent to the Secretaries of all recognized political parties on 2020.08.10.

The time old tradition of commencing the annual door to door voter enumeration conducted by Enumerators/Grama Niladaris on the first of June every year was delayed this year due to a host of reasons including, the spread of Covid-19 pandemic, Grama Niladharis engaging in prevention of Covid-19 pandemic related duties, imposition of quarantine curfew by the Government to control the spread of the pandemic, measures to allow public officers to work from home, restricting the number of officers to report to offices, and the involvement of a limited number of officers in the preliminary work related to the parliamentary election and circular instructions were issued to all District Registering / Assistant Registering Officers on 2020.08.17 together with the relevant work plan and specimens/instructions and requested them to commence the delayed electoral revision activities for 2020.

Arrangements were made to distribute Covid-19 hygienic items such as face masks, face shields and disinfectants, which were sent out for the use of polling staffs at the parliamentary election 2020 and returned unused and leftovers in the storage, to all Grama Niladharis / Special Enumerators in the island.

With regard to the electoral revision 2020, a letter dated 2020.10.07 was sent to the Secretaries of all political parties informing that if party representatives do not participate in house-to-house visits with the Grama Niladharis to observe field work related to the voter enumeration, it is

unlikely to expect lists to be inspected at least at the Grama Niladhari offices and party secretaries were requested to work with the respective Grama Niladharis to inspect the lists at Grama Niladhari offices.

Moreover, the Director General of Establishments, at the request of the Commission, had taken action to increase the payments made to Enumerators (Grama Niladharis), Acting Grama Niladharis and Special Enumerators for engaging in enumeration activities. Action was also taken accordingly to inform all District Deputy / Assistant Commissioners of Elections by the letter dated 2020.11.11 that the allowances to Enumerators, Acting Grama Niladharis and Special Enumerators who duly hand over the BC forms received from chief occupants of households in the area where he is assigned to carry out the enumeration with the necessary recommendations together with the "A" and "B" Lists and other reports including relevant statistics to the Elections Office on the appointed day (with due consideration to the curfew and travel restrictions) had been increased as indicated in the chart below.

All District Registering officers and District Deputy/Assistant Commissioners of Elections were provided with comprehensive instructions by the letter dated 2020.12.08 regarding display of "A" & "B" Lists in terms of Section 13 of the Registration of Electors Act, No. 44 of 1980 and regarding the receipt of claims and objections in connection with the electoral revision 2020 in terms of Section 1 4 of the Actand similarly all political party secretaries were informed thereof by the letter dated 2020.12.26.

Measures were taken to publish the Gazette Extraordinary No. 2207/4,dated 2020.12.22 (**Annexure 18**) appointing Assistant Registering Officers by name for the purpose of claims, objections, and field inquiries in connection with electoral revision 2020.

Letter dated 2020.12.31 sent to all District Registering / Assistant Registering Officers instructed them on the receipt of claims / objections and conduct of inquiries in connection with electoral revision 2020. All District Registering / Assistant Registering Officers were instructed by the letter dated 2020.12.19 to include or remove a name of any eligible person who has not been properly counted on the grounds of Covid-19 pandemic situation, during the process of rectifying omissions or errors prior to the certification in terms of Sub-sections 18 (2) and 18 (3) of the

Electoral Registration Act, No. 44 of 1980 and in the case of such rectification involves another district, the same should be brought to the notice of the Election Commission for approval.

Various programs were launched to register electors in areas where resettlement has partially been done or has not been done and steps were taken to verify whether the relevant persons are still living in those areas.

#### 7. Parliamentary Election – 2020

The 9<sup>th</sup> Parliamentary Election of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka was held on 05<sup>th</sup> of August 2020 from 7.00 am to 5.00 pm at 12954 polling stations.

- 7.1 In terms of the powers vested under the Constitution of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka, His Excellency the President dissolved Parliament by Gazette Notification No. 2165/8 (**Annexure 19**) dated 02.03.2020. With the announcement that the Parliamentary Elections would be held on 2020 25.04and the new Parliament would be convened on 2020.05.14, the Elections Commission made necessary arrangements for the holding of the Parliamentary Elections.
- 7.2 Also, the Gazette Notification No. 2165/17, dated 03.03.2020 (**Annexure 20**) was published regarding the nomination process of the Parliamentary election wherein it was announced the number of candidates to be included in the nomination lists for each electoral district and the information on securities to be deposited by independent groups.
- 7.3 Accordingly, security deposits were accepted at the office of the Returning Officer in 22 electoral districts of the island from 2020.03.03 until 12.00 noon on 2020.03.19 and nominations for the Parliamentary Election were received by the Returning Officers from 2020.03.12 until 12.00 noon on 19.03.2020. Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, the government declared 2020.03.16 as a public holiday and no nominations or deposits were accepted on that day.
- 7.4 Receiving of nominations was terminated at 12.00 noon on 2020.03.19 and a total of 697 nomination papers was received from 40 recognized political parties and 358 independent groups for the whole island. The respective District Returning Officers had reported to the Election Commission that 617 nominations were accepted and 80 were rejected. Accordingly, the total number of candidates contested was 7452. It was announced by the Gazette Notification No. 2167/12,dated 2020.03.20 (Annexure 21) that the Parliamentary Elections would be held on 2020.04.25.
- 7.5 In terms of Article 99A of the Constitution of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka, the names of 418 candidates from 22 recognized political parties were handed over to the Election Commission by 12.00 noon on 2020.03.19 and the particulars pertaining to the nominations to the National List were published in the Gazette Notification No. 2167/13 dated 2020.03.20 (Annexure 22).

- 7.6 However, in the aftermath of the outbreak of Covid-19 pandemic, the government declared a curfew on the entire island, imposed travel restrictions and restricted almost all government activities with permission granted for only essential services to run. In this backdrop the Election Commission decided that the conduct of the poll on 2020.25.04 as scheduled would not be possible and that the day of the poll would be 14 days after the 30<sup>th</sup> of April 2020. That decision was published in the Gazette Notification No. 2167/19, dated 2020.21.03 (**Annexure 23**) under Section 24 (3) of the Parliamentary Elections Act, No. 1 of 1981.
- 7.7 With the conclusion of receiving nominations for the Parliamentary election, the government imposed a curfew to curb the spread of the Covid-19 pandemic and restricted the number of officers reporting to duties at offices and allowed them to work from home this in turn compelled the Election Commission to temporarily suspend the execution of duties related to the Parliamentary election at the Head Office, District Election Offices and other public and private institutions. As a result, the District Election Offices including the Head Office of the Election Commission kept completely closed for about two weeks from 1<sup>st</sup> of April 2020. At the end of April, despite the risk of spreading the Corona virus, measures were taken to deploy a limited staff to check the accepted nominations, returned to the Head Office by the District Returning Officers and to hand them over to the Government Press for necessary action.
- 7.8 Gazette Notification No. 2172/3, dated 2020.04.20 (**Annexure 24**) was published announcing that the Parliamentary Election would be held on 2020.06.20.
- 7.9 Election Commission held extensive discussions with the health authorities and other stakeholders regarding the holding of the Parliamentary Election 2020 under the controlled Covid-19 pandemic situation. Discussions were also held with all the secretaries of parties that had submitted nominations, followed by several rounds of discussions with the Director General of Health Services / Heads of the National Center for the Prevention of Spread of the Corona Virus on the conduct of the election adhering to the health guidelines. Action was also taken to obtain written proposals / views of the parties on further action in this regard and to resumed preliminary worktowards the election.
- 7.10 The Road Map to conduct the Parliamentary election -2020 under the controlled Covid-19 pandemic situation was formulated following discussions thereon held primarily in Colombo and in several districts thereafter. Also, mock polls were conducted at district levels to study and obtain proposals / views / observations on the conduct of the forthcoming election adhering to the health guidelines.
- 7.11 Considering all these factors, the Election Commission decided to hold the Parliamentary Election on 2020-08-05 and steps were to announce the decision through the Gazette Notification No. 2179/17, dated 2020.06.10 (**Annexure 25**).

- 7.12 As the process of receiving postal vote applications / certification of postal voter lists had been completed, the issuance of postal ballots / handing over to the post offices was done on 30<sup>th</sup> of June 2020 and 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> July 2020.
- 7.13 The 13<sup>th</sup>, 14<sup>th</sup>, 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> July 2020 were set to mark postal ballots, the 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> July 2020 were allotted for postal voters who failed to mark ballots on the aforesaid dates and all District Returning Officers / Deputy / Assistant Commissioners of Elections. Advised were provided with instructions thereon. The fact that having regard to the Covid-19 pandemic, the staffs in the health sector were accorded the right to cast the vote by post for the first time in history at this parliamentary election is noteworthy.
- 7.14 The Gazette Notification No. 2184/18, dated 2020.07.15 (**Annexure 26**) was published announcing that the voting period of the parliamentary election would be from 7.00 am to 5.00 pm on 2020.08.05.
- 7.15 Another Gazette Notification No. 2186/7, dated 2020.07.27 (**Annexure 27**) was published announcing that the counting of votes would take place on 2020.08.05 and 06 and explaining the way the appointment of representatives should be made on 05 and 06.08.2020 and their participation in the count should be facilitated.
- 7.16 Based on the experience gained in the run up to the last 2019 Presidential Election and the number of accepted nominations received from political parties and independent groups for the Parliamentary Election-2020 and having regard to the length of the ballot paper, necessary steps were taken to provide cardboard ballot boxes to the polling booths this time as well. In keeping with the instructions received from the Election Commission to arrange the counting of ballots on the day following the day of poll, action was taken to provide all district election offices with large cardboard containers to be distributed to all counting centers forsafekeeping of the cardboard ballot boxes brought into such counting centersand for the affixing of seals before the party representatives.
- 7.17 Arrangements were made to send instructions / circulars to all District Returning Officers and Deputy / Assistant Commissioners of Elections on the future activities to be carried out in connection with the Parliamentary Election-2020. Action was also taken to recruit retired officers/casual workers to all district election offices including the Head Office as required to assist in the preliminary preparations of the election. Furthermore, action was taken to get all the documents / forms required for the forthcoming election printed and to distribute all documents / ballot papers / cardboard ballot boxes / ballot chambers as well as face masks, face shields, disinfectants, gloves including Covid-19 sanitary ware / materials and goods needed for the polling, counting of votes and declaration of results to all district election offices in time through the respective divisions. Thus, action was taken to conduct the poll of the parliamentary election-2020 successfully at 12984 polling centers across the island on 2020.08.05. Following the poll, the ballot boxes and other related materials were brought to counting centers where they were stored in large cardboard boxes for safekeeping until the count began on the following day. Counting of votes was successfully conducted on

2020.08.06 at a total of 2811 counting halls in the island including 2367 general counting halls and 444 postal voting counting centers. (Details of the number of polling booths and counting halls in each district are given in **Annexure 28**.)

- 7.18 As per the Electoral Register for 2019, the total number of registered voters was 16,263,885 and the total number of votes cast at the Parliamentary election held on 2020.08.05 based on that Register stood at 12,343,302 (75.89%) out of which 11,598,929 (71.32%) were valid votes and 744,373 (4.58%) were rejected votes. The Sri Lanka Podujana Peramuna(SLPP), a recognized political party with 68,53,690 votes (59.09%), won 145 seats and formed a government in the 16<sup>th</sup>Parliament. **Annexure 29** contains a detailed record of the number of votes and the number of seats received by each party and the relevant breakdowns according to electoral districts are included in **Annexure 30**.
- 7.19 Among the political parties that secured National List seats in parliament, the United National Party has not act to nominate someone to its solitary slot in the national list as at 2020.12.31.

#### 7.20 Election Monitoring

For election monitoring in Sri Lanka since the 1980s, the Department of Elections / Election Commission, with the concurrence of the parties contesting the elections, invited foreign election monitoring groups, followed by various local non-government organizations (NGOs) and other local organizations working to strengthen democratic traditions also came forward with the permission to monitor such activities during elections.

#### 7.20.1 Local Election Monitoring Groups

The following organizations which requested permission to observe the conduct of the Parliamentary election held on 2020.08.05 were granted permission by the Election Commission having considered the recent activities of those organizations and their experience in the relevant field as follows:

(A)

- I. People's Action for Free and Fair Elections (PAFFREL);
- II. Centre for Monitoring Election Violence (CMEV).

Permission was granted to the above two monitoring organizations to monitor postal voting activities, to monitor voting at polling stations through mobile observers, to station static observers at polling booths, and to monitor counting at counting centers and the executive directors of the two organizations were permitted to enter the polling stations and to enter the premises and counting halls for monitoring purposes.

(B)

- I. Transparency International Sri Lanka (TISL)
- II. National Polls Observation Centre (NPOC)
- III. Mothers and Daughters of Lanka (MDL)
- IV. Campaign for Free and Fair Election (CaFFE)

These monitoring organizations could engage in election monitoring only using mobile observers to monitor voting at polling stations in the districts where they had sought permission to do so.

#### **Volunteer Initiatives for Election Watch**

This monitoring organization had also requested permission to monitor the election and was permitted access only up to the entrance of the polling station premises to observe.

#### 7.20.2 Foreign Election Monitoring Groups

Foreign election observers from the European Union (EU) and the Commonwealth of Independent States (Commonwealth) were invited to visit the island to monitor the Parliamentary Elections held on 2020.08.05.

During that time, Sri Lanka too had fallen into the clutches of the COVID-19 pandemic and election observers from the above organizations were willing to visit the island despite the situation, and they were to visit the island adhering to the instructions issued by the Ministry of Health.

However, due to the threat of the spread of Covid-19 across the island and the closure of airports and the challenge to provide hotel facilities to accommodate foreign observers, bringing foreign observers to the island posed a serious problem. The Election Commission, therefore, decided to grant permission to only local monitoring groups to engage in election monitoring at the parliamentary election this time.

# 7.21 Facility to cast vote at another polling station under the provisions of the Parliamentary Elections Act No. 1 of 1981 as amended by the Parliamentary Elections (Amendment) Act, No. 15 of 1988.

In terms of Section 127B (1) of the Parliamentary Elections Act, No. 1 of 1981, any registered elector who reasonably fears that due to conditions prevailing in the area within which his polling station is situated, that he is unable to cast his vote at such polling station, may make an application to the Commissioner of Elections within one week of the notice of nomination, requesting that he be allowed to cast his vote at another polling station determined by the Election Commission, in its absolute discretion.

Accordingly, the Election Commission should within a week of receipt of an application, inform such elector whether such application is accepted or rejected.

Accordingly, a special polling station should be set up in the proximity to the address of the application to facilitate the elector to cast his. Where such vote is cast, such vote shall be counted at a special counting center along with the votes of the electoral district where such elector is registered.

Extraordinary Gazette Notification No. 2165/18, dated 2020.03.03 (**Annexure 31**) was published announcing the places where applications for voting at another polling station due reasonable fears can be obtained and the final date for receiving such application to be 2020.03.10. Accordingly, applications have been received as follows.

Accordingly, polling stations for the 6278 accepted applicants were set up in the Puttalam district. (**Annexure 32**)

#### 7.22 Establishment of Notified Election Offices

When the notified election offices in connection with the Parliamentary Election held on 5<sup>th</sup>August 2020 is taken into consideration, the term " notified ", in relation to any election office, means notified to the officer in charge of the police station for the area, and the Returning Officer or the Deputy / Assistant Commissioner of Elections for the electoral district, in which that office is situated, before such office is established. Offices established in accordance with the conditions laid down in respect of establishment of such offices are known as Authorized Notified Offices. In this regard, the Local Authorities Elections Division was mainly tasked with clarifying the types of notified election offices, the legal status of the respective notified election offices, and with providing necessary instructions on and applications for the establishment of notified offices to all candidates of the parliamentary election. A letter containing all the instructions in this regard was issued by the Election Commission on 2020.06.18 to all polling and authorized agents including the candidates of the parliamentary election with copies to the following officials for information and necessary action:

- 1. Inspector General Of Police (IGP)
- 2. Senior Deputy Inspector General Of Police (Elections)
- 3. All Returning Officers and the Deputy / Assistant Commissioners of Elections and officers investigating violation of election laws

- 4. All Staff officers of the Election Secretariat
- 5. Permanent Representatives of political representing the Committee to Investigate into Election Complaints
- 6. Executive Directors of Election Monitoring Groups
- 7. Chief of the Committee to Investigate into Election Complaints of the Election Secretariat

There are only four (4) types of election offices that can be maintained in terms of the provisions of Section 73 of the Parliamentary Elections Act, No. 1 of 1981. A list of persons who are authorized to set up election offices, the duration such offices could be maintained, the number of and possible areas where such offices could be established was prepared and distributed. Applications for permission to set up each type of office were printed in selected coloursfor easy identification and to minimize the hustle caused by not filling out the correct application specified for the type of office applied and on the other hand, printing of different colored applications made it more efficient to sort them as per the office classification. Accordingly, application for the Central Election Office was in yellow colour, white was for the notifiedbranch election offices, light pink was for the notified branch election offices set up in respect of each candidate during the silent period for the respective electoral district, and light purple was for the purpose of maintaining a propaganda office at the residence of the candidates.

In addition, the letter provided a clear clarification of the terms viz. 'electoral district', 'polling division', and 'polling district' and 'polling agent', 'authorized agent', and 'agent of the authorized agent' paving the way for the minimization of errors due to the unfamiliarity of these technical terms in electioneering.

The letter also instructed on the steps to be taken in displaying billboards, flags, candidate photographs etc. in the notified offices to minimize complaints regarding illegal propaganda activities which are a common violation of election laws during the election periods. Furthermore, it was announced with the view to preventing the misuse of public places such as public offices, buildings, lands, official residences, or reserves owned by the Government / Provincial Councils / Local Government Institutions / Public Corporations / Boards by the ruling party to carry out their election propaganda activities. The letter instructed further on the possibility for any candidate residing in a government-owned quarters, apartment complex with the proper permission to use a room in such house as a propaganda office, on the use of electric poles, highways, pavements, boundary walls, etc. adjacent to a notified office for propaganda purposes, and on illegal activities such as promoting or prejudicing another candidate in one candidate's office and informed the parties concerned that legal action would be taken against those who violate the law.

Objectives of enacting these laws included the minimization of advantages being created for one party or group by specifying the prescribed distances to be followed in setting up a notified election office near a government institution directly involved in the election and all candidates, polling agents, authorized agents and Secretaries of recognized political parties were urged to direct their agents and active supporters to refrain from setting up election offices in the proximity to government schools, hospitals, court complexes, local government bodies, post offices causing immense hardships to the public who frequent those public institutions or to

those students engaged in education at schoolsand the sole purpose of enacting these laws and requests was to uphold the highlighted fundamental principle of free and fair elections.

By specifying the minimum square areaforeach permitted office, it was possible to control to some extent the attempts disregarding the law to carry out propaganda work insmall temporary tin sheds or such small coconut huts or abandoned buildings on the pretext of maintaining notified offices. Measures taken to prohibit the use at all times of devices such as megaphones that amplify or reproduce the voice in these offices, and to prevent keeping election offices open outside the permitted period from 0600 hours to 2200 hours and parking in front of or near election offices causing traffic congestion on public roads, gathering a large number of supporters were handful to minimize inconveniences caused by such activities to the public. Steps were also taken to make opportunities available for candidates who found it difficult to set up election offices in places where such election offices have been set up for a long time due to these regulations to make representations thereon to the Returning Officer and apply for the special permission the Election Commission in order to prevent causing any prejudice to any candidate.

In addition, information was disseminated regarding the measures to be taken when setting up election offices on lands or in buildings belonging to places of worship and requests were made to refrain from seeking permission to set up or operate election offices at places where acts of undue influence stipulated in sub-section 79 (2) of the Parliamentary Elections Act No. 1 of 1981 may take place with the hope to avoid potential issues that may arise in the establishment of election offices.

In order to notify about the notified election offices, the relevant application form in the colourspecified for each category of offices should be completed in four (4) copies and submitted to the Returning Officer / District Election Office for approval, one copy of which should be retained by the Returning Officer / District Electoral Office and the remaining three (3) copies should be forwarded to the relevant police station and the OIC should endorse the permission to set up the office on those three copies and return 2 of the copies to the applicant while keeping one at the police station and the applicant should handover one copy to the office of the Medical Officer of Health and keep the remaining copy (the application form containing the permission so granted) always in a place where it can be easily observed by the officers of the Election Commission or police officers who come to inspect the election office.

The above regulations and conditions are required to prevent any untoward incidents such as election-related conflicts, assaults, injuries, killings, and political retaliation during the election period and to create a conducive environment for free and fair elections.

Upon the establishment of the notified branch offices, complaints regarding various issues involving offices were received from various quarters and the Local Authorities Elections Division too action to provide correct advice in this regard through the Elections Commission.

#### 7.23 Security

The IGP, on the instructions of the Commissioner of Elections, is responsible for enforcing the election laws from the time a poll is declared until one week after the election results are declared. Accordingly, the Election Commission, the Returning Officers, as well as the leaders

and candidates of the contesting political parties and the police officers are expected to perform their duties related to the enforcement of the election law.

Units will be set up at the Elections Secretariat as well as at the district level with the announcement of the election to enforce the election laws. In addition, steps were taken to establish special police units at the Divisional Secretariat or other government institutions, focusing on the size of the district and the areas where it was decided that special security should be provided.

Police officers were also deployed to guard the polling stations and the counting of votes and instruction classes on Enforcing Election Laws for All Announced Officers and OICs of the Police Department at the District Level were held covering all the districts. Officials of the Election Commission also contributed as resource persons.

#### **8.** Filling the Vacancies in the Membership of Parliament.

In the first quarter of 2020 action was taken to fill vacancies under Section 64 (5) of the Parliamentary Elections Act, No. 01 of 1981. Accordingly, the Secretary General of Parliament by his letter dated 21<sup>st</sup> January 2020, informed the Election Commission that Mr. Jayampathy Wickramaratne, a (National List) Member of Parliament nominated by the United National Party under Article 99A of the Constitution has resigned from his Parliamentary seat with effect from 21<sup>st</sup> January 2020 and the Commission in turn informed the General Secretary of UNP to make a suitable nomination to fill the vacancy so created. The UNP nominated the name of Mr. Weligodage Saman Ratnapriya Silva for the vacancy (Annexure 33) and the Commission took action to publish the name of Mr. Weligodage Saman Ratnapriya Silva declare elected as a Member of the Eighth Parliament in the Extraordinary Gazette Notification No. 2160/10, dated 2020.01.27 (Annexure 34).

#### 9. Provincial Council Elections.

Following the passage of the Provincial Council Elections Amendment Act No. 17 of 2017 by the Legislature amending the Provincial Council Elections Act No. 02 of 1988, a Delimitation Committee was appointed to determine the Provincial Boundaries in accordance with the said Amendment Act. Although the report of the Delimitation Commission was submitted in February 2018 the report was not passed by the Parliament. Thus, no arrangements have been made to hold the Provincial Council Elections so far, although the term of office of the last Provincial Council, the Uva Provincial Council, which was in operation until 08.10.2019, has come to an end. The Election Commission has from time to time brought this matter to the attention of His Excellency the President, His Excellency the Prime Minister, the Cabinet and the Leaders of all political parties represented in Parliament. But it has also criticized by the public for not holding the Provincial Council elections on time. However, the Commission's objection and dissatisfaction with the conduct of the Provincial Council system by the officials instead of the people's representatives without holding the Provincial Council elections has been referred to the relevant authorities.

#### 10. Filling of Vacancies – Local Authorities Elections Ordinance (Chapter 262)

**Annexure 35** contains the particulars of filling vacancies in the local authorities

#### 11. Special Projects

IFES (International Foundation for Electoral Systems) has provided technical support for many special projects conducted by the Election Commission, which has been providing technical assistance on the electoral process in over 140 countries since its inception in 1987. This institution has been working since 2005 to provide technical assistance to the then Department of Elections and since the establishment of the Election Commission in 2015, for the activities of an all-inclusive electoral process.

#### 11.1 Disables

Action taken for an election process that is inclusive of persons with disabilities

Matale District Assistant Commissioner of Elections organized a district level discussion on 19<sup>th</sup> February 2020 with the representatives of the organization of persons with disabilities with a view to resolving the common problems faced by persons with disabilities in the Matale District in casting their votes. During the discussions matters related to hardships faced by persons with disabilities in the Matale District in marking the ballots and the steps required to be taken in the future to find sustainable solutions for such issues were discussed in detail.

The election of the Technical Working Group for Disability Inclusive Elections in Sri Lanka (DIESL-TWG) to provide necessary technical assistance to the Election Commission to ensure the voting rights of persons with disabilities and the establishment of the committee at the district level was held on 2020.02.27. A committee consisting of seven organizations convened by the Enable Lanka Foundation was elected to the National Level Technical Committee. District Committee Leaders were also elected for Kilinochchi, Batticaloa, Anuradhapura, Matale, Kurunegala, Puttalam, Kandy, Colombo, Gampaha, Ratnapura, Polonnaruwa, Moneragala, Nuwara Eliya, Hambantota, Matara, Galle and Kalutara districts. The International Foundation for Election Systems (IFES) sponsored the event.

A preliminary discussion was held on March 10, 2020, at IFES on the formulation of a plan to be implemented for the protection of the voting rights of persons with disabilities in the years 2020-2021. This was done with the participation of the members of the Technical Working Group for Disability Inclusive Elections in Sri Lanka. Special attention was paid to the need for a sustainable strategic plan to conduct awareness programs for persons with disabilities for the elections to be held in the years 2020 and 2021 and to provide access facilities at polling stations.

With the decision to hold the 2020 Parliamentary Elections in a controlled Covid-19 pandemic situation, a discussion was held with the members of DIESL- TWG through ZOOM Technology on 2020.06.03 with a view to proposing special matters to be taken into consideration for the inclusion of Persons with Disabilities in the election process. The proposals and views expressed by them were brought to the attention of the Election Commission. Accordingly, in the 2020 Parliamentary Elections, it was possible to establish a programme in polling stations to enable voters with disabilities to mark their votes in a controlled Covid-19 pandemic situation adhering to health guidelines.

In parallel with the Parliamentary Election 2020, a series of awareness programmes were conducted for the disabled persons living in Uva, Central and Southern Provinces on the proper health practices to be followed in marking the vote and how should it be conducted in

accordance with the best health practices. From 24<sup>th</sup> to 30<sup>th</sup> July 2020 a series of awareness programmes were conducted in Buttala, Wellawaya, Bibila, Thanamalwila, Kandy, Matale, Tangalle and Matara following proper healthcare practices. The leaflets and video footages produced with the approval of the Election Commission were used herein as awareness tools. Nearly 250 disabled electors participated in those awareness programmes and they took the message to the community at the village level. These programs were organized with the contributions of the organizations of disabled person in the respective areas and District Leaders of the Working Group, the officials of the District Elections Offices who participated in those programmes as resource persons and with the financial sponsorship of IFES.

When a visually impaired person casts his vote, he has to seek the assistance of another to mark the ballot for him which puts the secrecy involved with his casting of vote at stake. To address this fundamental issue, a pilot project to introduce a stencil to insert the ballot was launched in the Nuwara Eliya District for the convenience of visually impaired voters and senior citizens at the Parliamentary Election 2020. The introduction of the stencil device and the pre-training programme was held on 2020.08.03 at the auditorium of the District Secretariat, Nuwara Eliya and the event was attended by fully visually impaired, partially visually impaired persons and senior citizens who were given pre-training to use the proposed newsystem. Following the training given on that day, action was taken to provide the polling stations where those who received the training were to cast their vote at the Parliamentary election held on 2020.08.05 with the required stencils to insert the ballots to mark. A follow up programme was conducted on 2020.08.23 at the auditorium of the Nuwara Eliya District Election Office to share the experience gained at the day of poll and to obtain views on the practical use of the stencils. Accordingly, they expressed that they were able to mark a valid vote in such a way as to ensure the secrecy of the ballot.

#### 11.2 Commemoration of International Days

#### 11.2.1 Observing the School Day of Non-Violence and Peace (January 30)

Kalutara District Election Office organized an awareness program for school children to mark the School Day of Non-Violence and Peace on 2020.02.06 at St. Mary's College, Matugama.

#### 11.2.2 World Social Justice Day (February 20)

Social justice is an underlying principle for peaceful and prosperous coexistence within and among nations. Adherence to the principle of social justice protects gender equality as well as the rights of indigenous peoples and migrants. Social justice is further enhanced by the removal of barriers faced by people due to gender, age, race, ethnicity, religion, culture, or disability. The main objective of social justice day is to provide equal opportunities for all for social security, social discourse, and the fundamental right to work.

The Kurunegala District Election Office organized a programme on 2020.02.20 at Sirisangabo Vidyalaya, Wanni Kudawewa, Giribawa to commemorate the World Social Justice Day which falls on the 20<sup>th</sup> of February and the Nuwara-Eliya District Election Office too conducted an awareness programme for the community at Bodhirukkaramaya, Gallella on 2020.02.23.

#### 11.2.3.International Mother Language Day (February 21)

International Mother Language Day is a worldwide annual observance held on 21 February since 2000 to promote awareness of linguistic and cultural diversity and to promote multilingualism. Mother tongue is simply defined as the language of one's birth or the language one first learns at a critical time from birth.

To commemorate the International Mother Language Day which falls on the 21st of February, the Kalutara District Elections Office organized a programme to arrange a library and donate bookstoGallelenakanda Primary School, Matugama on 2020.02.25.

#### 11.2.4 Public Service Day (June 23)

In order to mark the Public Service Day, a training program was conducted on 2020.25.09 at the Matale District Secretariat Auditorium for the officers of the Matale District Elections Office to develop the knowledge required to improve the provision of an efficient public service in a friendly manner to the public.

#### 11.2.5 International Children's Day (October 01)

The human child with a long childhood accumulates throughout that long childhood the gist of the future universe. It is our responsibility as adults to allow children to freely accumulate knowledge, imagination, and inspiration as they weave strange patterns into the universe with curious eyes and amazed mouths.

The Kalutara District Elections Office conducted a book distribution program at Gallenikanda Primary School, Matugama on 2020.10.06 to commemorate World Children's Day under above theme.

#### 11.2.6 International Democracy Day (September 15)

The Election Commission has organized various programs under the theme 'Youth Community for Democracy' on the occasion of International Democracy Day that falls on September 15, which aims to protect and promote democracy and its principles.

Accordingly, the Elections Commission and IFES jointly organized three programmes targeting various youth groups such as university students, technical college students, young provincial councilors, the National Youth Services Council, the Youth Parliament, and election observers.

#### 11.2.6.1 Ampara District

Ampara district programme was held at Ainah Beach Resort Ampara on 2020.09.17 from 10.30 am to 1.30 pm under the patronage of Mr. M.M. Mohamed, former Commissioner General of the Election Commission. Mr. M.M.S.K. Bandara Mapa, Deputy Commissioner of Elections, Mr. Shreen Yapa Boralessa, Assistant Commissioner of Elections and Mr. Thilina Wickramaratne, Ampara District Assistant Commissioner of Elections were also present at the occasion where 114 youths were present.

#### 11.2.6.2. Anuradhapura District

This program was held on 2020.09.18 from 10.30 am to 1.30 pm with the participation of 130 youths at the Heritage Hotel.

The event was presided over by Mr. Mahinda Deshapriya, the Chairman of the Election Commission and Mr. M.M.S.K. Bandara Mapa, Deputy Commissioner of Elections, Mr. Shreen Yapa Boralessa, Assistant Commissioner of Elections, and Mr. M.B.M. Sufian, Anuradhapura District Assistant Commissioner of Elections were also present. At this occassion the Chairman delivered a special keynote address on "Youth Participation in Democracy".

#### 11.2.6.3. National Program in Colombo District

This program was held in a grand manner on 2020.09.27 at the Central Bank Auditorium. The program was conducted in two phases and a panel discussion was held with the participation of young parliamentarians including the Hon. Namal Rajapaksa, Hon. Jeevan Thondaman, Hon. Kavinda Jayawardena, Hon. Shanakiyan Rajaputhiran Rasamanickam. It is noteworthy that various views were expressed by the audience on "Youth Participation in Democracy" and the "future enhancement of youth activism in politics".

Under the second phase of the program, a discussion, specially dedicated on issues such as self-employment and the media, was held. The exchange of views with the participation of Mr. Thanika Perera, Mr. Prasan de Viser, Ms. KumariniPrathapasinghe and Mr. Janith Perera turned out to be an in-depth discussion and received a massive response from the audience.

The programme conducted under the patronage of Mr. Mahinda Deshapriya, the Chairman of the National Elections Commission was attended by nearly 300 delegates including Mr. Nalin Abeysekere, PC and Prof. Ratnajeevan H. Hoole, Members of the Elections Commission, Mr. Saman Sri Ratnayake, Commissioner General of Elections and Additional / Deputy Assistant Commissioners of Elections.

The Chairman of the Election Commission Mahinda Deshapriya delivered a special keynote address on "Youth Participation in Democracy".

#### 12. Annual Action Plan

- 12.1 The Annual Action Plan was prepared with the assistance of the District Election Offices to achieve the objectives set out in the Four-Year Strategic Plan of the Election Commission and the progress report on the Strategic Plan and the Annual Action Plan was reviewed quarterly and progress reports were prepared.
- **12.2** The preparation of the Action Plan for the year 2021 had reached its final stage by December 2020.

#### 13. Strategic Plan

Aiding and coordinating the execution of duties and functions of the Commission through the District Elections Offices, conducting awareness workshops on election laws, electoral systems and electoral revision and lectures, art and poster competitions, do you know contests etc. for

scholars, student community, officials of various institutions / organizations, general public and members of voluntary organizations were among activities carried out, as stipulated in the four year-Participatory Strategic Plan of the Election Commission for the year 2017-2020.



#### 14. Media Coordination

Awareness programmes for the Heads / Executive Officers/ News Directors / News Editors of all Electronic and Print Media Institutions, Editors' Guild, Permanent Representatives of the Committee on Media Guidelines, and the journalists engaged in media coverage of the Election Commission on duties and functions of the Commission, parliamentary election - 2020, electoral revision – 2020, media guidelines, and on other matters related to the electronic media use during the election periods. During the year 2020, 06 rounds of media briefings have been conducted.

This Division also engaged in coordinating television and radio programs attended by the Chairman and Members of the Election Commission and issuing press releases accordingly.





#### 15. Record Room

Action was taken to relocate the Record Room of the Election Commission in anew premise and to operate it in a more organized manner. Arrangements were made to ensure the safety of its documents and to store them properly for easy reference by any party.

A full-time officer was attached to the Record Room for this purpose, and he wasreferred to the National Archives for formal training on archives, thereby enabling him to perform the services of the Record Room more effectively.

#### 16. Special Activities Carried Out in 2020

Action was taken to launch a quarterly newsletter "Kathiraye Balaya" on the duties and functions of the Election Commission under the identified thrust areas in the four-year Participatory Strategic Plan of the Election Commission for the year 2017-2020. The first and second editions (January-August) of its fourth volume were released as a single edition. The draft third and final edition of the newsletter for 2020 has already been finalized for printing in January 2021.





• A trilingual book on the parliamentary elections held from 1947 to 2015 was published to mark the 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Parliament.



#### 17. Legal Affairs

#### 17.1 Consultations with the Attorney General

Actions were taken to send following letters to the Attorney General seeking his advice on cases filled in respective courts:

• Letter dated 2020.06.09 addressed to the Attorney General seeking advice on the case filed in the Court of Appeal against Elkaduwa Plantation Company.

- Letter dated 2020.06.20 addressed to the Attorney General seeking advice on the legal status regarding the gathering of people and conducting candidate's propaganda meetings in connection with the Parliamentary Election 2020.
- Two letters dated 2020.06.16 and 2020.06.22 addressed to the Attorney General seeking advice on the case No. SC / Writ / 08/2019 filed against the denial of election campaigning on LED screens during the Presidential Election 2019 and on the legal status of campaigning on LED screens at the Parliamentary Election, respectively.
- The Attorney General's advice regarding the error in the counting of votes of the election to the WennappuwaPradeshiya Sabha had been sought earlier and a document containing the calculations was forwarded to Dr. Avanthi Perera, Senior State Counsel on 2020.06.20 for the reference of the Attorney General's Department. The report of the Committee appointed by the Election Commission to inquire into this matter had been forwarded immediately on receipt.
- Letter dated 2020.07.12 addressed to the Attorney General seeking his advice regarding the complaint made citing that Mr. Sudath Dissanayake, Chairman of the Ratnapura Pradeshiya Sabha and Mr. Kaluarachchige Ranawaka Kaluarachchi are unfit to hold the membership of the Pradeshiya Sabha.
- Letter dated 2020.07.28 addressed to the Attorney General seeking advice regarding the facilitation for electors placed under quarantine to vote at the parliamentary election.
- Letter dated 2020.08.11 addressed to the Attorney General seeking advice regarding the National List seat in Parliament of Our Power of People Party.
- Letter dated 2020.08.14 addressed to the Attorney General seeking advice on whether Sri Lanka Telecom (SLT) is a Public or a Private entity.
- Letter dated 2020.08.19 addressed to the Attorney General seeking his advice regarding the Chairman of the Weligama Urban Council who was alleged to have promoted his candidature at the parliamentary election using his office of Chairman.
- Letter dated 2020.09.07 addressed to the Attorney General seeking his advice on the registration of new political parties for the year 2020.
- Letter dated 2020.10.19 addressed to the Attorney General seeking his advice on the appointment to the post of Chief Accounting Officer of the Election Commission.
- Letter dated 2020.12.09 addressed to the Attorney General seeking his advice on the complaints received regarding the disqualifications of the Chairman of the RatnapuraPradeshiya Sabha and of another member to hold such office.

• Letter dated 2020.11.27 addressed to the Attorney General seeking his advice again regarding the erroneous calculation of votes in wards of WennappuwaPradeshiya Sabha in Puttalam District.

## 17.2 Participation in discussions with the Attorney General's Department regarding litigation

Following action has been taken with regard to letigation in connection with the electoral process:

- Asst. Commissioner of Elections (Legal) was present in courts at the hearings of Supreme Court Cases viz. SC/ FR/83/2020, SC/ FR/85/2020, SC/ FR/86/2020, SC/ FR/87/2020, SC/ FR/88/2020, SC/ FR/89/2020, SC/ FR/92/2020andSC/ FR/115/2020.
- Mrs. Dharani Upeka Weerasekera, Asst. Commissioner of Elections (Legal) also participated in a discussion with Ms. Navodi de Zoysa, State Counsel of the Attorney General's Department on 2020.06.02 regarding the cases filed in connection with the rejection of nomination papers.
- Mrs. Dharani Upeka Weerasekera, Asst. Commissioner of Elections (Legal) met Dr. Avanthi Perera of the Attorney General's Department and Mr. Suren Gnanaraj, Senior State Counsel to discuss restrictions imposed on propaganda the campaigns at the Parliamentary elections. This discussion was held on 2020.06.26 at the Attorney General's Department.
- Mrs. Dharani Upeka Weerasekera, Asst. Commissioner of Elections (Legal) also met Mrs. Indika Demuni de Silva, Additional Solicitor General of the Attorney General's Department on 2020.08.14 to discuss matters related to the case No. SC/FR/221/2020.
- Participation in the discussion with Mr. Medhaka Fernando, State Council on the Case No. DSP/10/2020 on 28.08.2020.
- Participation in the discussion held with Mrs. Viveka Siriwardene, Deputy Solicitor General regarding the CA/Writ/237/2020 case filed by Mr. Sani Rohana Kodithuwakku regarding the number of preferential votes in the Kolonna polling division in the Ratnapura District at the Parliamentary Election 2020. Mr. Suranga Ambagahatenna, Deputy Commissioner of Elections, Ratnapuraalso attended to this meeting.

#### 17.3 Amendments to Election Laws

#### 17.3.1 Amendment of the Registration of Electors Act No. 44 of 1980

The Registration of Electors Amendment Bill No. 44 of 1980 was published as a supplement in the Gazette on 18.09.2019 but as there was no action to pass it as an Act, action has been taken to submit it back to the new Cabinet for implementation

#### 17.3.2 Legislation to control election expenses

At present, the Election Commission has reviewed the Bill drafted to control election expenses and submitted the relevant amendments to the Legal Draftsman. Subsequently, it was referred to the Attorney General and his consent was obtained, but due to the appointment of the new government, it needs to be submitted to the new Cabinet again. Thus, the Secretary to the President has been informed about this and a letter has been sent to the new Cabinet requesting that the relevant draft be submitted for approval.

**17.3.3**. A discussion on the amendments to the election laws was held at the Ministry of Justice and Prison Reforms and as decided at the discussion, action was taken to submit a report to the Ministry containing the observations and proposals of the Elections Commission regarding proposed amendments to the laws.

**17.3.4.** Also, the letter dated 2020.02.12 was addressed to the Secretary to the President requesting him to bring to the kind attention of His Excellency the President of the urgent need to introduce amendments to election laws.

#### 17.4 Providing Legal Advice and Other Legal Matters

- Necessary legal advice was provided in response to numerous letters received seeking advice on suspensions and appointments during the election period.
- Anuradhapura, Moneragala, Nuwara Eliya, Kegalle, Ratnapura, Galle, Kurunegala and Colombo District Election Offices had sought legal advice on the conduct of Presidential Election 2019 and the disposal of B.C. forms used for the electoral revision and necessary observations in that regard were made to the National Elections Division.
- Legal advice was provided on the rejection of nomination papers, transfers, and on the Parliamentary election referred by the District Election Offices and other institutions.
- The report submitted by the Anuradhapura High Court regarding the voting rights of persons subjected to imprisonment was studied and necessary observations were made to the National Elections Division.
- Legal advice was provided to the Local Authorities Elections Division on the cases filed against the removal from the UNP membership and on filling the resultant vacancies.
- The matter of forged signatures in nomination papers for Parliamentary Election 2020 was referred to the relevant authorities for legal action.
- The report on the electoral list requested by the Mount Lavinia Magistrate's Court in connection with a case pending in the court was promptly submitted.

- Took action to obtain a report from the Matale District Returning Officer and Assistant Returning Officer regarding the letter sent to the Election Commission alleging that the preferential results in the Matale District wereflawed.
- Letter dated 2020.09.15 was addressed to the Presidential Secretariat to pursue action regarding the salaries of the public employees who contested the parliamentary election -2020 as candidates.
- Legal advice on the revision of the electoral register was provided to Matara, Kalutara, Gampaha North and Ratnapura District Election Offices on request.
- On a request made by the Anuradhapura District Elections Office, necessary advice was provided on the legal provisions related to contesting the provincial council elections.
- Legal advice was also provided on issues raised in letters addressed to the Election Commission by other parties and such letters were referred to the respectiveDivisions for necessary action.
- A letter was addressed to the relevant disciplinary authorities requesting that a report be submitted to the Election Commission on the disciplinary action against public officers who did not participate in the duties of the Parliamentary Election-2020.

Relevant quarters were informed of the request made to provide declarations of assets and liabilities of a member of a Local Government Institution.

### 17.7 Acting under Section 7 (4) a to recognize political parties in the Parliamentary Elections Act No. 1 of 1981.

The number of applications submitted for registration of political parties in the year 2020 was 156 and the number of applications initially rejected by the committee was 40. Out of the 40 applications initially rejected, 06 were submitted for reconsideration and the total number of applications called for interviews was 121. After a lengthy process of conducting interviews and reviewing the relevant documents, the following parties were declared recognized as political parties by Gazette Notification No. 2197/19 dated 14.10.2020.

#### 17.7.1 Actions pertaining to Political Parties -

- Arranged a meeting with the Secretaries and Permanent Representatives of Political Parties on 2020.02.26 at the Election Commission.
- Convened a meeting with the disputing fractions of the Elever Democratic Front on 2020.01.20 and 2020.03.10 to discuss the issues.
- Discussions were held on 2020.03.10 with the representatives of political parties viz. Ahila Ilangai People's Congress, the United Lanka People's Party, the United Lanka General Assembly Party, the Liberal Party and the Sri Lanka Progressive Front which are plagued by internal disputes. Accordingly, the power only to sign nominations for the 2020 Parliamentary Elections was vested in Mr. Rishad Bathiudeen, the leader of Ahila Ilangai People's Congress and in Mr. Rajanathan Prabhaharan, the leader of Elever Democratic Front Party.
- The United Lanka People's Party, the United Lanka General Assembly Party and the Sri Lanka Progressive Front were declared disqualified from contesting the parliamentary election 2020, as the parties had failed to resolve internal disputes. It was also announced that the Liberal Party would be able to contest the parliamentary election as it could resolve its internal disputes.
- The list of political parties was updated to coincide with the parliamentary election 2020 and was published as a gazette notification.

#### 17.8 Other Functions of the Legal & Investigation Division

Preliminary work of the establishment of the Law Library has already commenced and a letter has been sent to the Government Printer inquiring about the relevant case reports and legislations and we have already received a reply in that regard. Action will be taken with the approval of the Commissioner General of Elections, to purchase the required reports, legislations, and other books in the future.

#### 18. Actions pertaining to the Right to Information Act, No. 12 of 2016

- As at 31.12.2020, 80 requests for information have been received under the Right to Information Act, No. 12 of 2016 and the providing information for 70 of those requests has been completed. 04 requests for information have been turned down.

### 22. Construction and Assets

### 23. Purchase of materials, purchase / repair / maintenance of machinery

### 23.1 In relation to elections

Parliamentary elections were to be held on August 10 due to the corona epidemic in the country after the nominations were called in March 2020.

- Other items related to the Parliamentary election, including stationery and printed forms, fixed items and items related to polling stations and counting centers were procured and distributed to the District Election Offices following the correct procurement procedure.

- Rs. 41.28 million was spent on printing poll cards for the Parliamentary elections.
- Due to the increase in the number of candidates for the parliamentary elections, special ballot boxes made of the same type of cardboard used for the last presidential election were introduced. It cost around Rs. 10 million.
- Necessary approval was obtained to obtain a temporary telephone connection for the District Election Offices and the District Election Offices were informed accordingly.
- The parliamentary election was held at a time when the whole country was at risk of spreading the corona epidemic. As a result, a voter protection program had to be put in place.

To this end, arrangements have been made to follow various hygiene practices and to procure materials such as hand washing liquids, disinfectants, face masks and face shields and to distribute them to the officials and election staff.

### 23.2 Applicable for registration of voters

- Arrangements were made to print BC forms with and without data required for all districts
  for the annual voter registration process. About 50 lakhs of BC form with data and about 4
  lakhs BC forms without data were printed by the Government Press and about 11.75 lakhs of
  data were printed by the private sector and then distributed based on the request made by the
  District Offices.
- Measures have been taken to purchase and issue the required stationery and documents at a cost of Rs. 10 lakhs for voter registration.

### 23.3 Printing of Electoral Registers

After printing the 2019 Electoral Register, action was taken to distribute it to the relevant District Offices and around Rs. 10 million was paid to the relevant press. The voter registration process for 2020 has commenced with the conclusion of the parliamentary elections and the relevant districts will be inspected and distributed to the election offices after the printing of electoral registers in the country.

### 23.4 In connection with the purchase / repair / maintenance of machinery

- Machinery including 30 computers, 05 computer printers, 04 DCP machines, 08 fingerprint
  machines and 05 laptops for the needs of Head Offices and District / District Election Offices
  have been procured and issued at a cost of Rs. 10.65 million.
- 19 air conditioners were purchased and installed for air conditioning at Head Offices and District Election Offices at a cost of Rs. 4.14 million had to be spent.
- Necessary repairs were carried out on computers, computer printers, photocopiers and air conditioners at the Head Offices and District Election Offices where the warranty period was over. For that Rs. 0.92 million had to be spent.
- Purchase of toner and drum units for computer printers and photocopiers used in offices at a cost of Rs. 11.5 million has been spent. This expenditure has increased due to the parliamentary elections.
- Purchase of other inventory items including 70 QR Code Readers for Rs. 78.6 lakhs were spent.
- Action was taken to procure and supply goods, equipment and software required for networking telephones of Head Office and all District Offices with internet facilities. For that Rs. 4.5 million has been spent.
- To obtain service agreements for the computer printers, photocopiers and air conditioners available at the Head Office and all District Offices Rs. 1.6 million was spent.
- Machine tools such as computer printers, laptops, televisions and photocopiers were rented out to the district offices as well as the head office on demand during the election. Rs. 6.7 million had to be paid as the rent for those machines.

### 23.5 Purchasing office supplies

Arrangements were made to procure various office items such as executive desks, chairs, cabinets, cupboards, shelves, computer desks required for the staff officers and staff of the Head Office and District Offices. For that Rs. 3.6 million had to be spent. Action was also taken to approve the purchase of office supplies at the divisional level as per the requirement and recommendation of the staff officers of the District Offices during the election period.

### 23.6 General

- Large quantities of stationery had to be procured to meet the parliamentary election, electoral register printing, voter registration and other office paperwork. For that Rs. 157 million was spent.
- The ballot boxes in the district offices that needed to be repaired were brought and handed over to the government factory and repaired and returned to those offices at a cost of around one million rupees.
- To purchase drinking water for the drinking water requirement of the head office Rs. 4.9 lakhs were spent.
- Rs. 0.16 million had to be spent for the internal telephone connection, its necessary equipment and repairs.
- The purchase of tires for the District Elections Offices was done on the basis of approval to be done at the local level and the purchase and supply of tires for the vehicles of the Elections Secretariat on demand was successfully carried out. Following the procurement scheme, Rs. About 2.5 million was spent in this regard.
- Arrangements were made to sell ballot papers and disposable papers used at the head office and district offices. For that Rs. 7.99 million has been credited to government revenue.
- In the year 2020, Rs. 131 million was paid to the Government Press for printing of ballot papers and other documents related to the election.
- The CCTV system was newly installed to monitor the security of the head office. For that Rs. 2.5 million was spent.
- Materials such as masks, face shield, gloves, hand sanitizers and hand lotions had to be procured for the health of voters and election officials. For that Rs. 165.9 million had to be spent. Also, 650 thermometers had to be purchased and issued at a cost around Rs. 13 lakhs.

### 24. Progress in Information Technology

Developed the "ElectionS" computer program designed and developed by the Information Technology Division.

### 24.1 With regard to the revision of the Electoral Registers 2020,

Prepare a computer program containing the details of the registered voters required for the printing of BC forms for the purposesof electoral register and submit it to the Government Printing, develop a computer program to obtain multiple registration information, providing necessary technical advice and guidance in carrying out the revision of electoral registers

through the computer program, correction of errors in handling of the computer program by the Electoral District Officers during the revision of the Electoral Registers and correction of errors in old electoral registers, providing necessary technical assistance to the District Election Officers to obtain the Electoral Register extracts, preparation of the computer program to obtain the list of persons who have completed 18 years of age as at 31.05.2020 from the data of persons who have not attained the age of 18 years computerized during the 2019 Electoral Register extracts and providing necessary guidance. In addition, an online voter registration computer program is being developed.

### 24.2 Provision of e-services for the Examination of Electoral Registers,

- Providing e-service for schools, zonal education offices, officers at district election office to check the registers of the current year and previous years.
- Providing e-service facilities for the officers of the government offices to provide information to fill the postal voting applications.
- Providing necessary assistance to schools and officers at zonal education office in using e-services and resolving issues that arise.
- Preparation of computer program for Grama Niladharis to carry out voter registration activities through e-service. (Still in progress)
- Arranging activities to provide necessary information to the Government Printing Department, Department of Registration of Persons and Department of Census and Statistics.

### 24.3 With regard to the Parliamentary Elections,

Creating and using a computer program to apply for postal voting online, improving the computerization program of postal vote certification officers, develop a computer program to obtain a document with the addresses of postal voters, develop a computer program to register displaced voters, preparation of a computer program to obtain the supplementary voter register, improvement of the program to computerize the information in the data sheets related to the Census of Officers (ARO, SPO, CCO and other staff).

## 24.4 Other IT applications designed and developed by the Information and Communication Technology Division

- ➤ Updating the information system to facilitate the online submission and approval of leave applications of the Head Office Officers.
- ➤ Improving the computer program (Expenditure Management System) designed to enter the account summaries of the District Election Offices.
- ➤ Update the database containing information on computers and computer peripherals used at the Head Office and all District Election Offices.
- ➤ Preparation of a computer program for traffic management of the Election Commission. (Still in progress)
- ➤ Preparation of a computer program for postal management of the Election Commission (still in progress)

- ➤ Preparation of computer programs for reservation of head office auditoriums and reservation of Nuwara Eliya Holiday Resort. (Still in progress)
- ➤ If the Covid 19 epidemic spreads further in the future and the district offices are unable to function, the relevant arrangements will be made to provide the technical facilities required for the officers in charge of the polling divisions to work from home to use the database safely.

### 24.5 System Maintenance

Carrying out the Activities of the Data Center established at the Head Office and the Data Disaster Management Center established at the Elections Office in Hambantota and obtaining the relevant maintenance work by those institutions, Perform maintenance of the Computers, computer peripherals, computer networks, VPN Network and the ADSL Internet System in the District Election Offices including the Head Office Divisions of the Election Commission, Maintenance of information subsystems such as Video Conference system, Provide the required service to the officers and other stakeholders by maintaining the relevant agreements up to date and maintaining the complete information system of the Election Commission efficiently and effectively.

## 24.5.1 Activities related to the official website / social media networks / emails / systems of the Election Commission

Completely redesigning the official website of the Election Commission and maintaining it in all three languages. In addition, updating social media network systems, including the official Facebook page, maintaining the office email service, refer public complaints received through the website and social media networks to the appropriate parties and respond to them.

## 24.6 Carrying out the activities of the Information Technology Division related to the Parliamentary Elections held on 05.08.2020.

### 24.6.1 Official Poll Cards and Postal Voting

Official poll card file inspection, preparing for printing and handing over to the Procurement Division, issuing CDs prepared at district level for District Election Offices, Sri Lanka Army, Navy, Air Force, Sri Lanka Police and Civil Defense Force to provide information for filling postal voting applications, providing necessary facilities to the District Election Offices for the inclusion of postal votes in the computer system, support for development and application of program compiled to computerize the information in the datasheets related to the officer census, preparation of documents with postal voting addresses and postal ballot register, preparation of list of deceased and overseas voters, carrying out the marking of multiple registration information in the electoral register to be sent to the polling stations, preparing the required data for the stickers printed on the "D" and "A" envelopes used for postal voting.

### 24.6.2. Preparation of results and release to the media

Computer program developed by the Lanka Software Foundation under the supervision of the Information Technology Division was checked using past election results or test-level data and connecting all districts and training of relevant officers, carrying out the process of giving the certified election results immediately to the media institutions and electronic media which have obtained the right to broadcast the certified election results, upgrading an additional computer program (Backup System) that is required to continuously provide the results to the media in the event of a sudden crash of that result system, providing the result processing system required for the use of the District Results Declaration Center and training the relevant officers, conducting training programs for Assistant Directors of IT and IT Officers deployed in the District Results Processing Centers and Results Processing Division of the Head Office, scanning the District Election Results and obtaining them at the IT Division at the same time and inserting them into the additional computer system, improving the Centralized Polling Station Monitoring SMS Service to get the voting progress from the Senior Presiding Officers, develop a computer program for digital dashboards on the status of polling stations and the issuance of results and display it at District Results Processing Centers and Head Office.

### 24.6.3. Activities related to political parties and competing independent groups

- Prepare a list with the addresses of postal voters and provide it to the competing political parties and independent groups.
- Preparation of CDs containing Electoral Registers and Voter Addresses and handing over to the District Election Offices.
- Preparation of CDs containing **2019** Electoral Registers to various parties for sale / for approval charge upon approval.
- Update all gazettes, press releases and election results related to the parliamentary elections on the official website in all three languages.
- Providing necessary information to party secretaries by email.

### 24.6.4. Pilot Projects

Develop a computer program to facilitate issuance / acceptance at polling stations and use it as a pilot project in Colombo District. (Colombo Central, Ratmalana and Moratuwa polling divisions), use of e Poll Book as a Pilot Project in 05 Polling Stations in Colombo District. (Colombo West and Kaduwela polling divisions)

Submitting a report to the Telecommunications Regulatory Commission to obtain communication facilities for polling stations without telephone signals, compiling a report based on the data obtained during the Polling Station Monitoring Program through the SMS service of the Central Polling Station Monitoring System during the **2020** Parliamentary Elections.

Gathering and reporting the experiences, suggestions and issues of the District Electoral Officers and Operations Room Officers who used polling station monitoring via SMS service in the Central Polling Station Monitoring System during the **2020** Parliamentary Elections and referring them to the Commissioner General of Elections for further action.

### 25. Financial and audit information

Rs. 5700.7 million has been spent as at 31.12.2020 for the Parliamentary Elections held on 05.08.2020. The outstanding bills / vouchers of this election worth about Rs. 23 million are yet to be paid on that day as liabilities. Accordingly, the expected expenditure for the parliamentary elections will be around Rs. 5724 million.

The preparation of the Electoral Register for the year 2020 has cost around Rs. 163.9 million and when Rs. 08 million, the expected cost of printing the register is added, the cost is around Rs. 172 million. The cost of preparing the Electoral Register for this year has increased by about Rs. 26 million compared to the cost of preparing the Electoral Register for the year 2019 which was Rs. 146.3 million. The increase in the allowance of the officers who count the electors has contributed to the increase in these expenditures.

Recurrent expenditure in 2020 was Rs. 7300.8 million and in 2019 it was Rs. 3989.4 million. Overall, it shows an increase in recurrent expenditure compared to the previous year. In the face of the Covid19 epidemic, holding parliamentary elections in line with health care guidelines has led to an increase in recurrent spending.

Rs. 13.71 million has been spent on awareness programs including Voters' Day related activities which are held on 1st June every year.

Capital expenditure in 2020 was Rs. 71.2 million, which is a decrease of Rs. 53.1 million compared to 2019. Restrictions on purchases and building improvements in the face of the Covid epidemic have thus contributed to the reduction in capital expenditure.

Out of 136 officers / employees who applied for disaster loan advances this year, loan advances amounting to Rs. 15.9 million were granted to 117 officers / employees. Compared to the previous year, the amount of loans disbursed this year has decreased by Rs. 11.35 million.

Revenue from the issuance of electoral register extracts for the year 2020 was Rs. 2.8 million. The revenue for the year 2019 was Rs. 5.9 million and compared to that year the revenue from the issue of extracts has decreased by Rs. 3.2 million. This was due to the corona epidemic, holding of parliamentary elections and restriction on the issuance of electoral register extracts.

The preparation of electoral registers as books was restricted and they were being prepared as CDs. The revenue earned from selling them this year is 3.4 million rupees. This year's revenue is slightly higher than last year's revenue of Rs. 3.2 million due to the sale of CDs to political parties as preparations for the forthcoming parliamentary elections began.

Rs. 3.4 million has been spent on local and foreign training courses to train officers / employees to improve the performance of the Commission. Compared to the year 2019, this expenditure has increased by nearly 0.6 million rupees.

During the year 2020, the Internal Audit Division conducted 12 audit activities and submitted 12 audit reports. All of them had been answered. Also, 03 meetings of the Audit and Management Committee have been held.

17 audit queries have been submitted up to 31.12.2020 under various subjects for the year 2020. Of these, 13 queries are for the financial year 2019 and 04 queries are for the financial year 2020. Action will be taken to provide answers for all audit queries but except for one of those within the stipulated time frame.

- 6. Thereafter the Agents of the Party / Group whose preferences will be counted next can enter the counting hall on the request of the Chief Counting Officer;

- 3. It is a mandatory requirement to quote the National Identity Card Number of the applicant on the application which must be certified by the relevant Grama Niladhari where the applicant resides. Applications without the certification by the Grama Niladhari will be rejected.

# Report of the Auditor General on the financial statements of the Election Commission for the year ended 31<sup>st</sup> December 2020 in terms of Section 11 (1) of the National Audit Act, No. 19 of 2018.

#### 1. Financial Statements

# 1.1 Qualified Opinion

The Audit of the financial statement of the Election Commission for the year ended 31<sup>st</sup> December 2020 comprising the statements of financial position as at 31<sup>st</sup> December 2020 and the statement of cash flow statement for the year then ended and notes to the financial statements including the summary of significant accounting policies, was carried out under my direction in pursuance of provisions of Article 154 (1) of the Constitution of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka read in conjunction with the provisions of the National Audit Act, No. 19 of 2018. My report to Parliament in pursuance of Section 10 of the National Audit Act, No. 19 of 2018 read in conjunction with the provisions in Article 154 (6) of the Constitution will be tabled in due course.

In my opinion except the force exerted from the facts contained in paragraph 1.6, the accompanying financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the Commission as at 31<sup>st</sup> December 2020 and of financial performance and its cash flows for the year ending on that daythen ended in accordance with Sri Lanka Accounting Standards.

#### 1.2 Basis for Qualified Opinion

I qualified my opinion based on the facts contained in paragraph 1.6 of this report. I conducted my audit in accordance with Sri Lanka Auditing Standards (SLAuSs). My responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the audit of the financial statements section of my report. I believe that the audit evidence, I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my qualified opinion.

# 1.3 Responsibilities of Chief Accounting Officer for the Financial Statements

Chief Accounting Officer is responsible for the preparation of the financial statements that give true and fair view in accordance with Sri Lanka Accounting Standard and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatements, whether due to fraud or error.

As per Section 16(1) of the National Audit Act, No.19 of 2018, the Commission is required to maintain proper books and records of all its income, expenditure, assets, and liabilities, to enable preparation of annual and periodic statements.

The Chief Accounting Officer should ensure that an effective internal control system is in place for the financial control of the Commission in terms of sub-

section 38 (1) (c) of the National Audit Act and that the effectiveness of the system is reviewed from time to time and accordingly make any alterations as required for such systems to be effectively carried out.

# 1.4 Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

My objective is to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an Auditor's report that includes my opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with Sri Lanka Auditing Standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

As part of an audit in accordance with Sri Lanka Auditing Standards, I exercise professional judgment and maintain professional scepticism throughout the audit. I also -

- \* Identified and assessed the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, designed and performed audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtained audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.
- \* Obtained an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the internal control.
- \* Evaluated the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates and related disclosures made.
- \* Evaluated the overall presentation, structure, and content of the financial statements, including the disclosures, and whether the financial statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

I communicate with the Chief Accounting Officer regarding, inter alia, significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that I identify during my audit.

# 1.5 Report on Other Legal and Regulatory Requirements

#### 1.6 Comments on Financial Statements

#### 1.6.1 Statement of Financial Performance –

#### **1.6.1.1** Recurrent Expenditure

The Commission had incurred a total sum of Rs. 1,465,847 for the provision of janitorial and security services during the reviewed year under the Expenditure Head 20-01-1409- (2) -10M which is applicable to Parliamentary election expenses but not to the expenses incurred for the head of above purpose.

#### 1.6.2 Statement of Financial Position

# 1.6.2.1 Non-Financial Assets

The following observations are made.

- (a) According to the financial statements of the Commission last year, the cost of vehicles as at 31<sup>st</sup>December 2019 was Rs.143,032,850 but the starting balance for the year under review had been stated as Rs.150,586,977.
- (b) Even though the value of the buildings and constructions stood at Rs. 1,455,823,908 as at 31<sup>st</sup> December 2019, the balance as at 01<sup>st</sup>January 2020, has been indicated as Rs.251,359,839 in the financial statements for the year under review.
- (c) A capitalized sum of Rs. 5,500,000/-had been indicated in the statement of non-financial assets for an official house and land in the Tamankaduwa area, but according to the Fixed Assets Register, the Commission did not have such an official quarter.

- (d) Three items of buildings and lands in Badulla district had been capitalized for Rs. 55,900,000/-, however there were only 2 items of buildings and lands to the value of Rs. 40,000,000/- in the Fixed Assets Register.
- (e) The value of the Nuwara-Eliya Circuit Bangalow, as per the Fixed Assets Register, was Rs. 62,688,175/-, however, it has been capitalized in the statement of non-financial assets for a sum of Rs.19,744,008/-.
- (f) Even though a sum of Rs.37,655,991/- had been capitalized as the value of the Nuwara-Eliya Election Office, its value as per the Fixed Assets Register, was Rs.32,777.500/-
- (g) The land and the official quarters of the Batticaloa District Assistant Commissioner of Elections which was vested in the Commission by the District Secretary, Batticaloa on September 03, 2010, had not been assessed and accounted for even by 31st December 2020.
- (h) As per the Fixed Assets Register, the value of the official quarters of the Matale District Assistant Commissioner of Elections was Rs. 14,501,000/-, however, it has been stated as Rs. 13,400,000/- in the statement of non-financial assets.
- (i) As per the Fixed Assets Register of the Commission, the value of the official quarters and land of the Kandy District Assistant Commissioner of Elections was Rs. 25,755,000/-, however, it has been accounted for as Rs. 25.812.500/- in the financial statements.
- (j) The sum accounted for as the value of the Gampaha, Bandiyamulla official quarters, office building and the garage had been over stated by Rs. 942.315/than the value of the Fixed Assets Register.
- (k) Commission had not submitted evidence to prove the undisputed ownership of the buildings and lands in respect of which a sum of Rs. 1,175,185,612/- has been capitalized by the Commission.
- (l) Even though the value of other machinery and office equipment was Rs. 394,831,778/-, as per the financial statements as at 31<sup>st</sup> December 2020, the starting balance thereof has been indicated as Rs. 420,544,037/- in the financial statements for the current year.
- (m) Even though the acquisition of capital assets under expenditure heads 020-1-1-02102 and 020-1-1-02103 in the year under review was Rs. 33,199.528/-, only Rs. 33,126,828/- out of that amount had been capitalized.
- (n) According to the schedule on disposals, the expenditure on assets disposed of in the current year was Rs. 1.890,235/-, however, in the statement of non-financial assets the disposal cost has been mentioned as Rs. 13,197,516/-. In addition, there were differences of Rs. 3,883,977 and Rs. 4,953,979 in the disposal schedules and financial statements for the years 2018 and 2019,respectively.

#### 1.6.3 Cash Flow Statement

# 1.6.3.1 Cash Flow generated from Operations

The following observations are made:

- (a) Although the expenditure for personal emoluments and operating expenses for the year under review was Rs. 5,468.840,351/-, it was recorded in the Cash Flow Statement as Rs.5,433,751,913/-.
- (b) According to the Expenditure Ledger for the year under review, the expenditure incurred on construction or acquisition of physical assets and acquisition of other investments, was Rs.41,199,528/-, but in the cash flow statement it was stated as Rs. 68,983,765/-.
- (c) Subsidies and transfers of Rs. 4209,529/- during the year under review had not been recorded.
- (d) Although the non-imprest receipts of the Commission for the year under review were Rs. 53,187,629, it was stated in the Cash Flow Statement as Rs.38,120,868/-

# 1.6.3.2 Cash Flow generated from Investments

Even though the recovery of advances in the year under review was Rs. 20,419,166/-, it has been stated as Rs. 14,474,555.

#### 1.6.3.3 Cash Flow generated from Financial Activities

Following observations are made:

- (a) Deposits received in the year under review were Rs. 15,618,686/-, however, it had been stated in the Cash Flow Statement as Rs. 15,233,372/-.
- (b) Deposits Payments in the year under review were Rs.18.311,539, however, it had been stated in the Cash Flow Statement as Rs. 9,875.355/-.

#### 1.6.4. Records and books not maintained

The following observations are made:

- (a) The fixed asset register and vehicle accident register maintained by the Commission had not been kept up to date.
- (b) The register of damages maintained in accordance with Financial Regulations 110 had not been kept up to date.
- (c) The Matara District Office had not properly maintained the leave register and the departure register.

#### 2. Financial Review

# 2.1 Non-Compliance with Laws, Rules, and Regulations

# **Laws, Rules Regulations**

#### **Comments**

# (a) Chapter XIX of the Establishments Code

(i) Paragraph 5.2 & 5.3

Although rent should be charged at the rate of 10% of the salary of the officers who are entitled to the scheduled quarters and 12% of the salary of the married officers who are not entitled to such scheduled quarters, Commission instead of charging the monthly rent as per the provisions of the Establishments Code, had taken action to charge an economic monthly rent of Rs. 2000/- each from four officers including the Chairman and Rs.1,500 / from one Member of the Commission.

(ii) Paragraph 5.6

Although the powers vested with the Divisional Secretary should be exercised in charging rent for specific houses, the Commission has not obtained such approval when charging economic rent.

# (B) Financial Regulations of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka

(i) Financial Regulations 137

 A cost estimate of Rs. 32,000 had approved for the removal of a tree in the premises of the Commission but the same amount was paid for the removal of the tree branches without removing the tree.

- Although the head of the institution had approved the purchase of only 20 CCTV cameras, cost Rs. 2,542,004 had been paid to purchase of 52 CCTV cameras.
- (ii) Financial Regulations The file affiliation of the vouchers related to 138(8) the payments made by the Matara District Office was not mentioned.
- (C) Paragraph iv of Public Administration Circular No. 09/2009 dated 16 April 2009

Public Rs. 82,392 was paid as holiday pay to one 9/2009 officer who employed full time on temporary basis without fingerprinting on the fingerprinting machine, to mark the arrival and departure.

- (D) Presidential Office Circular No. PS/ACU/CCU/01/02 dated 16 August 2018
  - Although the Chairmen of the independent Commissions received an official vehicle and 225 liters of fuel or a fuel allowance at market price, apart from that, during the period from January to August 2020, Rs. 1,456 liters of diesel and 1,628 liters of petrol valued at Rs.374,460 were provided to the Chairman of the Commission.
  - Although the Chairman and the members
     of the commission are not entitled to
     official quarters, lodging facilities were
     provided to the Chairman and a member
     while obtaining an economic rent.
  - In addition to the telephone allowance

allowed by the circular, a special telephone allowance of Rs. 60,000 was paid to the Chairman of the Commission for the months of June, July and August of the year under review.

(E) Cabinet Memorandum No. අමප/04/0716/001/018 dated 22 July 2004 When the election has to be held due to the expiration of the term of office, the holiday pay can be paid for a limited number of staff grade officers which is determined by the Commissioner of Elections for a period from one month prior to the date of the call for nominations for that election to four months after the close of polling, exceeding the limits specified in the Public Administration Circulars. However, in the payment of holiday allowances for the Presidential Election 2020, all the staff officers of the permanent staff had been paid holiday pay of Rs. 2,583,019 for all the holidays held from 02 March to 05 August 2020.

(F) Paragraph 5 of Budget Circular No. 07/2019 dated 04 December 2019.

300 daily planners for the year 2020 were printed at a cost of Rs. 199,500 although diaries and calendars for the year 2020 should not have been printed using money from the Consolidated Fund or any other statutory fund.

(G) Election Commission Circular No.2020/03 dated 12 August 2020

When paying allowances for election duties, there is a requirement to an appointment letter and a letter of attendance for the confirmation of performed duties. But Rs. 1,284,757 were paid without such confirmation.

#### 2.2 Informal transactions

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Following observations were made.

- (a) The Chairman, a member and two officers of the Commission have entered into a private transaction based on state property owned by the Commission and obtained Rs. 5,200,000 from the Metro Colombo Urban Development Project.
- (b) According to the Cabinet Decisions and Parliamentary Resolutions approved from 5<sup>th</sup> July 2016, the members of the Commission will be entitled to a transport allowance of Rs. 50,000 if the distance from their place of residence to the Commission Office is more than 350 km. But transport allowances of Rs. 2,400,000 for a period of 4 years, as Rs.50,000 per month, have been paid to a member of the commission who lived in the Glen Arbor building paying an economic rent.

# 3. Operational review

#### 3.1 Procurement

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Following observations were made.

- (a) In accordance with paragraph 5.3.2 of the Procurement Guidelines, the Invitation to bid shall contain appropriate and relevant basic information required by prospective bidders to prepare the Bid or Quotation, including main eligibility criteria and qualification requirements of the successful bidder. However, that guideline has not been followed in either procurement of 100 ml and 500 ml hand sanitizers costing Rs. 374,058 or 51 hand sanitary liquid cans costing Rs. 223,560.
- (b) In terms of paragraph 3.3 of the Procurement Guidelines, Limited National Competitive Bidding shall be followed when only a few sources are available to obtain goods here. When the instances of shopping should be used Limited National Competitive Bidding system were used in 12 procurements to procure low value items of standard specifications with a large number of suppliers.

- (c) According to the paragraph 6.2.2 of the Procurement Guidelines, in the case of limited national competitive bidding, the minimum bidding period was 21 days, but in 5 instances that minimum bidding period was not given.
- (d) Rs.1,010,500 has been paid to the committee members and staff for 17 procurement activities contrary to Appendix 32 of the Procurement Guidelines and without verifying the holding time of the Technical Evaluation Committees and Procurement Committees.
- (e) Committee members and staff were paid Rs. 123,000 for four procurements worth less than Rs. 12 million, even whom not following the procedures to be followed, though it followed the limited competitive bidding system.
- (f) Rs.399,500 has been paid to the committee members and other staff for 17 procurement activities which were carried out following shopping method contrary to Appendix 32 of the Procurement Guidelines.
- (g) In terms of paragraph 2.8.1 (b) of Procurement Guidelines the technical committee should consist of subject specialist/s, and at least one member who is having sufficient knowledgeable on Procurement procedures. However, no subject specialist has been appointed to the relevant technical evaluation committee for the purchase of hand sanitizers at a cost of Rs. 89,319,056.
- (h) In terms of paragraph 1.2.1 (C) of the Procurement Guidelines, Procurement process should ensure providing fair, equal, and maximum opportunity for eligible interested parties to participate in procurement. However, only 11 sample test reports out of the 37 companies that bided for the supply of hand sanitizers at a cost of Rs. 89,319,056 for the 2020 Parliamentary Elections have been assessed.
- (i) As per paragraph 7.8 (a) of the Procurement Guidelines, the Bid shall be rejected and excluded from further consideration if the Bid is not accompanied by the required bid security. But procurement worth of

Rs. 8,175,492 has been awarded to an institution which did not submit a bid security for the purchase of tissue papers.

(j) As per paragraph 8.12.13 of the Procurement Guidelines, for Goods, the officer in charge shall issue a certificate that the Goods supplied are in accordance with the specifications and other agreed terms, the quantity supplied is in accordance with the contract provisions and all warranties, guarantees and manuals which are customarily supplied for such Goods. But no such action had been taken when purchasing tissue papers worth Rs. 8,402,292 in total.

# 3.2 Asset Management

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Following observations were made.

- (a) A motorcycle worth of Rs. 144,900 was parked unused at the Commission premises.
- (b) A building was constructed at government expense on a land at the Heen Ela premises adjacent to the head office that was not belonged to the Commission.
- (c) It costs an additional Rs. 38,500 to repair the boards containing the vision and mission of the institution that was to be mounted on the wall near the front reception counter due to the color mismatch of the letters that were once fixed as it was done without proper planning in the preparation of the boards.

# 3.3 Losses and damages

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Following observations were made.

(a) No action had been taken by 31st December 2020 to write off the total loss of Rs. 122,900 from the books that were incurred by the Commission from the years 2018 and 2019.

- (b) No action has been taken to write off from the books the loss of Rs. 35,417 which could not be recovered due to the accidents of a cab of the Election Commission on two occasions during the year under review.
- (c) Although the loss of Rs.15,000 due to the disappearance of 27 mattresses in 2016 has been included in the register of losses, no action has been taken to write off them from the books.

#### 3.4 Non-economic transactions

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The CCTV camera system installed at the office of the Commission in 2018 at a cost of Rs. 976,361 with 32 cameras was removed without the approval of the Commissioner General of Elections and a new system with 52 cameras was installed in 2020. Only 12 cameras that were removed from the old system are now installed at the Gampaha District Elections Office, while another 20 cameras in the old system still remained unused.

# 3.5 Management weaknesses

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13 vehicles whose lease expires on December 31, 2020 have not been taken over.

#### 4. Sustainable Development

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# 4.1 Identify the Sustainable Development Goals

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The Commission had not identified the Sustainable Development Goals.

# 5. Human Resource Management

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The following observations were made.

(A) Six posts approved for the Commission have been vacant for a period of 2-6 years and officers have been appointed to act in / perform duties continuously.

- (B) Although the number of approved Assistant Commissioner of Elections posts is 20, but the actual number is 23.
- (C) Department of Management Services has approved a post of Information and Communication Technology Officer on temporary basis for a period of one year from September 30, 2019. The Institute has released an officer of Technical Service I attached to the Colombo Municipal Council, attached him to the post of Technical Officer and appointed him as the Acting Information and Communication Technology Officer and has been employed for more than one year. A retired officer was appointed to the post of Technical Officer on contract basis.
- (D) Officers had been appointed to act / perform duties in respect of 5 posts approved by the Commission and their permanent posts had not been confirmed for the audit.
